Sri Lanka Journal of Agrarian Studies (SLJAS) is a peer reviewed, journal published by annually by Hector Kobbekaduwa Agrarian Research and Training Institute. The journal is devoted to publishing latest findings of research studies and investigations and review of books on issues related to agrarian and rural development in Sri Lanka and other countries in the region.

The journal attempts to provide a viable forum for scientist and researchers to share, and discuss issues and perspectives in diverse areas relevant to the agrarian and rural sector. Accordingly, multi-disciplinary as well as interdisciplinary papers are accepted to be published covering areas like agricultural and production economics, extension and communication, marketing and market intelligence, food and nutritional security, price policy, post-harvest losses, mitigation and adaptation to disasters occurring due to climate change, water and environmental resources management, people's participation and social mobilization, community and rural development, land tenure and agrarian relations, land settlement, poverty, income diversification and non-farm employments, micro finance labour and migration.

 Original contributions to the discipline in an honorary capacity are accepted for publication with the understanding that they have not been published or accepted for publication elsewhere. Papers accepted for publication in this journal may not be published elsewhere in the same form and language or any other language without the consent of the Editorial Board.

Editorial Process: The Editor-in-Chief and Associate Editors assess the initial suitability of articles submitted.

2. Reviewing Policy - The papers submitted will be reviewed by the expert panel. The refereeing process is "double-blind": The identity of the author remains anonymous to the referee and *vice versa*. Authors may be asked to re-submit their article in revised form, though in all but exceptional circumstances, the Editor will consider only on resubmission.

Submission of paper not withstanding to the guidelines will be returned to the authors without being considered for review.

Submissions considered to be suitable for the SLJAS sent out at least two reviewers who will referee the articles. Unsuitable articles are returned to the author.

3. **Manuscript Structure**:

- Title Page: The Name(s) of author(s), Affiliations and addresses of all authors, Email address of the corresponding author
- Abstract: Maximum 200 words/Font size- 11, Italic
- Key words: up to maximum of 6/8 keywords
- Introduction
- Methods/Methodology
- Results and discussion
- Conclusions
- Acknowledgements
- References

4. **Preparation of Manuscript**:

There is no restriction on the length of articles, but contributions of 8,000 maximum words are preferred. Articles in excess of this limit cannot be considered for publication

- * Manuscripts would be prepared using MS Word (version 2007 or higher)
- * Text should be:

Font - Calibri Font size 11" Margin - Left 1.5", Right 1" Space - 1 space Full justify Paper size - B5

Reference – Harvard System (i.e. author(s), names and date of publication to be given in the body of the text and the references collected alphabetically at the end of the paper.

Eg. Ranaweera, N.F.C., Samarathunga, P.A. and Hafi, A.A.B. (1990), *Economics of Paddy Production: Past, Present and Future,* Proceedings of Rice Congress, Department of Agriculture.

Signs and Symbols for Units – Always use internationally accepted signs and symbols for units (SI units)

5. Figures and Tables:

- Figures and tables should be arranged, as far as possible, in portrait with headings and labels orientated horizontally, using black and white or colour.
- All figures and tables must be cited in the article. The final placement
 of figures and tables within your article will be determined by where
 they are first cited
- Tables should be submitted in MS Word. They should not be submitted as images or in a graphic format. Table created using Excel should be converted to MS Word.
- Please try and fit tables into a single page. If more than one page is required, please ensure that the correct column headings are repeated on each page.
- Please use the superscript letters a, b, and c for explanatory footnotes within the table
- Standard errors should be in parentheses (...) and placed below their corresponding coefficient
- Report only two decimal places for all statistics
- It is advisable to keep charts, graphs and footnotes to a minimum.

Each author is entitled to one copy of the journal and 03 off-prints of his/her article free of charge. Manuscripts not accepted for publication will be sent back under registered cover.
