

Rice Wholesale

Wholesale prices of local samba grade II and local raw red have increased by 1% due to low supply of stocks to the market. Their price ranges were Rs.98.00-103.00/kg and Rs.84.00-85.00/kg respectively. Prices of samba grade I, nadu and raw white have not changed significantly during this week, and prices ranged between Rs.105.00-108.00/kg, Rs.92.00-95.00/kg and Rs.85.00-93.00/kg respectively.

Wholesale price of imported *ponni* samba has decreased by 2% due to high supply of stocks to the markets and the price ranged between Rs.78.00-83.00/kg. Prices of imported nadu and raw white have not changed significantly and their price ranges were Rs.71.00-75.00/kg and Rs.62.00-76.00/kg respectively.


Compared to the same period of last year, current wholesale prices of all the local rice varieties have increased in the range of 22%-34%, while the price of imported *ponni* samba has decreased by 33%.

Retail

Prices of all the local rice varieties have increased. Price of raw red has increased by Rs.2.00/kg. Prices of samba grade II and nadu grade II have increased by Rs.1.00/kg. The highest local rice price of Rs.120.00/kg for samba grade I was reported from Wellawatta, Thotalanga and Kadawatha markets. The lowest local rice price of Rs.85.00/kg for raw

red was reported from Pettah, Narahenpita, Dematagoda and Kadawatha markets.

Meanwhile, prices of all the imported rice varieties have increased. The highest imported rice price of Rs.95.00/kg for samba was reported from Wellawatta, Kirulapone and Nugegoda markets. The lowest imported rice price of Rs.70.00/kg for raw white was reported from Wellawatta, Kirulapone, Narahenpita and Kadawatha Markets.



Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of all the local rice varieties have increased in the range of 16%-33%. Price of imported *ponni* samba has decreased by 29%.

Paddy

Producer Price

Prices of all the paddy varieties have further increased in all considered major producing areas due to the limited supply of paddy. Prices of short grain have increased by less than Rs.2.00/kg. Prices of long grain white paddy have increased in the range of Rs.1.00-2.00/kg and the lowest price increase recorded from Polonnaruwa. Price ranged between Rs.45.00-56.00/kg and Rs.45.00-

55.00/kg for short grain and long grain paddy respectively. Paddy harvesting in 2017 *Yala* season has been already completed in most of the major paddy producing areas. Meanwhile, the prices of long grain red paddy ranged between Rs.46.00-50.00/kg.

Compared to the same period of last year, price of both short grain and long grain (red and white) paddy varieties have increased in the range of 17%-41% and the highest price increment was reported for long grain white paddy in Polonnaruwa.

Dried Chillies

Wholesale

Wholesale price of imported dried chillies has increased by 1% due to increased CIF price and the price ranged between Rs.185.00-210.00/kg.

Compared to the same period of last year, the current wholesale price of imported dried chillies has decreased by 32%.

Retail

Price of imported dried chillies has increased by Rs.4.00/kg, and the price ranged between Rs.220.00-300.00/kg. The highest price was reported from Wellawatta and Kirulapone markets, while the lowest price was reported from Pettah, Dematagoda and Kadawatha markets.

Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail price of imported dried chillies has decreased by about 30%.

Onion

Wholesale

Wholesale prices of both local red onion varieties have increased due to low supply of stocks to the market. Price of "Sinnan" has increased by 7% and the price ranged between Rs.250.00-275.00/kg. Price of "Vedalan" has increased by 2% and the price ranged between Rs.290.00-330.00/kg. Price of imported red onion has decreased by 6% due to high availability of "Sipla" in the market. Price range of imported red onion was Rs.280.00-320.00/kg and the price range of "Sipla" was Rs.90.00-105.00/kg.


Wholesale prices of both local and imported big onion have decreased due to increased supply of local big onion to the wholesale market. Price of imported big onion has decreased by 6% and the price ranged between Rs.75.00-100.00/kg. Price of local big onion has decreased by 2% and the price ranged between Rs.70.00-85.00/kg.

Compared to the same period of last year, current wholesale prices of all the red onion varieties have increased in the range of 18%-328%. Price of local big onion has increased by 19%, while the price of imported big onion has decreased by 3%.

Retail

Price of "Vedalan" has increased by Rs.1.00/kg, and the price ranged between Rs.350.00-440.00/kg. The highest price was reported from Narahenpita and Dematagoda

markets, while the lowest price was reported from Pettah and Kadawatha markets. Stocks of sinnan and imported red onion were not available at retail markets.



Meanwhile, the price of imported big onion has decreased by Rs.15.00/kg, and the price ranged between Rs.100.00-150.00/kg. The highest price was reported from Narahenpita market, while the lowest price was reported from Pettah and Thotalanga markets. Price of local big onion has decreased by Rs.20.00/kg, and the price ranged between Rs.100.00-140.00/kg. The highest price was reported from Narahenpita market, while the lowest price was reported from Pettah, Thotalanga and Kadawatha markets.

Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail price of “Vedalan” has increased by 182%. The prices of imported and local big onion have increased by 48% and 19% respectively.

Potato Wholesale

Wholesale prices of all types of potatoes have increased due to low supply of local stocks to the market. Price of “Welimada” potato has


increased by 5% and the price ranged between Rs.95.00-105.00/kg. Prices of “Nuwara Eliya” potato and imported potato have decreased by 3% and the prices ranged between Rs.110.00-130.00/kg and Rs.85.00-102.00/kg respectively. (Price ranges were Rs.85.00-95.00/kg for “Chinese” potato, Rs.85.00-95.00/kg for “Pakistan” potato and Rs.90.00-102.00/kg for “Indian” potato).

Compared to the same period of last year, current wholesale prices of both types of local potato have increased in the range of 20%-21%, while the price of imported potato has increased by 10%.

Retail

Price of Nuwara Eliya potato has increased by Rs.1.00/kg, and the price ranged between Rs.160.00-180.00/kg. The highest price was reported from all the markets in Colombo area except Pettah, Kadawatha, Thotalanga and Kiribathgoda markers, while the lowest price was reported from all the markets in Colombo area.

Moreover, the price of imported potato has increased by Rs.2.00/kg, and the price ranged between Rs.100.00-130.00/kg. The highest price was reported from Thotalanga, Kadawatha and Kiribathgoda markets, while the lowest price was reported from all the markets in Colombo area except Wellawatta, Kirulapone, Nugegoda and Kiribathgoda markets.



Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of Welimada and Nuwara Eliya potato have increased by 6% and 8% respectively. Price of imported potato has not changed significantly.

Pulses

Wholesale

Wholesale price of red cowpea has decreased by 2% due to high supply of local stocks to the market and the price ranged between Rs.220.00-290.00/kg. Price of green gram, has decreased by 1% due to high availability of stocks in the market and price ranged between Rs.190.00-210.00/kg. Prices of both white cowpea and red dhal have not changed significantly during this week and their average prices were Rs.235.00/kg and Rs.133.00/kg respectively.

Compared to the same period of last year, the current wholesale prices of red cowpea, green gram and white cowpea have increased in the range of 14%-31%, while the price of red dhal has decreased by 19%

Retail

Retail price of green gram has decreased by Rs.4.00/kg, and the price ranged between

Rs.205.00-280.00/kg. The highest price was reported from Wellawatta, and Narahenpita markets, while the lowest price was reported from Pettah market. Retail price of red cowpea has decreased by Rs.3.00/kg and the price ranged between Rs.300.00-360.00/kg. The highest price was reported from Wellawatta, Kirulapone and Narahenpita markets, while the lowest price was reported from Pettah market. Further, the price of white cowpea has decreased by Rs.2.00/kg and the price ranged between Rs.260.00-360.00/kg. The highest price was reported from Wellawatta and Dematagoda markers, while the lowest price was reported from Dematagoda and Kadawatha markets.

Meanwhile the price of red dhal has decreased by Rs.1.00/kg and the price ranged between Rs.140.00-180.00/kg. The highest price was reported from Wellawatta market, while the lowest price was reported from Narahenpita and Kadawatha markets.

Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of red cowpea, white cowpea and green gram have increased by 32%, 23% and 6% respectively, while the red dhal has decreased by 10%.

Vegetables

Wholesale

Prices of most of the vegetable varieties have increased, due to continuous low supplies in the end of *Yala* harvesting period.

Considering upcountry vegetables, prices of all the vegetable varieties except beans have increased. The highest price increase was reported for leeks, beetroot and raddish as Rs.14.00/kg due to low supply from the main upcountry producing areas. Next, prices of carrot and knolkhol have increased by Rs.12.00/kg and Rs.8.00/kg respectively. Further price of cabbage has increased by Rs.2.00/kg. However, the price of beans has decreased by Rs.7.00/kg due to high supplies from Balangoda, Bandarawela and Welimada areas. Price of tomato has increased by Rs.4.00/kg due to high quality stocks received from Sooriyawewa area. Further price of capsicum has increased by Rs.8.00/kg due to low supply from Wellawaya and Thalawakele areas.

Considering low country vegetables, prices of all the vegetable varieties except cucumber, luffa and long beans have increased. The highest price increase was reported for drumstick as Rs.23.00/kg due to limited supply received from Dambulla and Kalpitiya areas. The second highest price increase was reported for brinjal as Rs.8.00/kg due to supplies coming from only Embilipitiya and Rajanganaya areas. Next, price of pumpkin has increased by Rs.7.00/kg due to high quality "Arjun" and the stocks of local variety received from Nochchiyagama producing areas. Further, price increase of all the other price increased vegetables were in the range of Rs.1.00-4.00/kg. However,

prices of cucumber, luffa and long beans have decreased in the range of Rs.1.00-2.00/kg.


Price of green chillies has increased by Rs.15.00/kg due to limited stocks received from Nochchiyagama and Puttalam producing areas. Further, price of lime has increased by Rs.10.00/kg due to low supply from Moneragala.

Compared to the same period of last year, the current wholesale prices of most of the vegetable varieties have increased with the highest price increase of 691% reported for green chillies.


Retail

In line with the increased wholesale prices, retail prices of most of the vegetable varieties, except tomato have also increased.

Considering upcountry vegetables, prices of all the vegetable varieties, except beans have increased. The highest price increase was reported for leeks as Rs.39.00/kg. The second highest price increase was reported for knolkhol as Rs.18.00/kg. Prices of all the other vegetable varieties have increased in the range of Rs.3.00-10.00/kg.



Further, the price of tomato has decreased by Rs.13.00/kg and price of capsicum has increased by Rs.22.00/kg.



Regarding lowcountry vegetable varieties, prices of all the vegetable varieties except cucumber, luffa and long beans have increased. The highest price increase was reported for drumsticks as Rs.34.00/kg. The second highest price increase was reported for snakegourd as Rs.15.00/kg. Prices of all the other vegetable varieties have increased in the range of Rs.1.00-12.00/kg.

Further, prices of green chillies and lime have increased by Rs.80.00/kg and Rs.26.00/kg respectively.

Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of all the vegetable varieties have increased with the highest price increase of 169% reported for green chillies.

Coconut

Wholesale

Prices of both large and small nuts have decreased by Rs.1.00/nut. Prices ranged

between Rs.75.00-80.00/nut for large nuts and Rs.65.00-70.00/nut for small nuts.

Compared to the same period of last year, the current wholesale price of a large nut has increased by 63% and price of a small nut has increased by 81%.

Retail

Prices of both large and small nuts have decreased by Rs.1.00/nut. Prices ranged between Rs.80.00-90.00/nut for large nuts and Rs.70.00-75.00/nut for small nuts.

Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail price of a large nut has increased by 44% and price of a small nut has increased by 61%.

Fruits

Wholesale

Prices of all the fruit varieties have decreased due to unfavorable weather condition and high supply. The highest price decrease of 26% was noted for slime apple due to high supply from Anuradhapura areas and low quality fruits available at the wholesale market. The second highest price decrease of 16% was noted for avocado due to rainy weather condition and high supply from Kandy, Gampola and Welimada areas. The prices of wood apple has decreased by 15% due to harvesting season.

Further, the price of grapes (Imported) has decreased by 15% due to low quality stocks received from China and the low demand. Prices of both karthakolomban and vilad have

decreased by 7% and 11% respectively due to high supply from Anuradhapura and Dambulla areas and the low demand. Furthermore, prices of anamalu and ambun have decreased by 5% due to high supply from Ratnapura, Deniyaya and Pelmadulla areas. Prices of ambul, kolikuttu and seeni have decreased in the range of 4%-5% due to high supply from Embilipitiya and low demand. The price of papaw has decreased by 4% due to high supply from Vavuniya, Anuradhapura and Thambuthegama areas. Prices of all the sizes of pineapple have decreased in the range of 1%-4% due to high supply from Gampaha and Kurunegala areas and low demand. Also the price of orange has decreased by 2% due to high supply from Bibila. The price of king coconut has decreased by 2% due to low demand. The price of passion fruit has decreased by 1% due to high supply from Kandy and Gampola areas.

According to market information, prices of most of the fruit varieties are expected to decrease in the coming week due to low demand and the rainy weather condition.

Compared to the same period of last year, current wholesale prices of most of the fruit varieties have decreased and the highest price decrease of 52% was noted for pineapple (small size).

Retail

In line with the decreased wholesale prices, retail prices of all the fruit varieties have

decreased with high supplies and low demand. The highest price decrease of Rs.32.00 fruit was reported for karthakolomban. The price of vilad has decreased by Rs.6.00/fruit. Prices of all the sizes of pineapple have decreased in the range of Rs.11.00-22.00/fruit. The price of slime apple has decreased by Rs.8.00/fruit due to high supply. Prices of ambul, kolikuttu and seeni have decreased in the range of Rs.4.00-7.00/kg. Also, prices of anamalu and ambun have decreased by Rs.4.00/fruit and Rs.3.00/fruit respectively. The price of orange has decreased by Rs.5.00/fruit due to high supply. Further, the price of papaw has decreased by Rs.5.00/kg. The price of grapes (imported) has decreased by Rs.4.00/kg due to low quality stocks available at the retail market. Prices of avocado and king coconut have decreased by Rs.2.00/fruit and Rs.1.00/fruit respectively due to low demand. The price of wood apple has decreased by Rs.1.00/fruit due to high availability in harvesting season.

Compared to the same period of last year, current retail prices of most of the fruit varieties have decreased and the highest price decrease was reported for karthakolomban as 49%.

Fresh Fish

Wholesale

Prices of all fresh fish types except shrimp have decreased due to increased supplies. The highest price decrease of 7% was noted for

balaya, hurulla, paraw and kelawalla and the price ranged between Rs.200.00/kg and Rs.230.00/kg in balaya, Rs.200.00/kg and Rs.260.00/kg in hurulla, Rs.500.00/kg and Rs.650.00/kg in paraw and Rs.550.00/kg and Rs.600.00/kg in kelawalla. Further, prices of thalapath and salaya have decreased by 4% and 2% respectively. Meanwhile, of price increased fresh fish types a 1% price increase was noted for shrimp and the price ranged between Rs.900.00-1,000.00/kg.

Compared to the same period of last year, current wholesale prices of most fresh fish types have increased in the range of 11%-36%, and the highest price increase was noted for thalapath.

Retail

Retail prices of all the fresh fish types except shrimp have decreased significantly in line with the decreased wholesale prices. The highest price decrease was reported for balaya as Rs.59.00/kg, and the price ranged between Rs.230.00/kg and Rs.720.00/kg. The second highest price decrease of Rs.55.00/kg was reported for thora, and the price ranged between Rs.1,200.00/kg and Rs.2,000.00/kg. In addition, price of paraw has decreased by Rs.54.00/kg, and the prices ranged between Rs.650.00/kg and Rs.1,200.00/kg.

Further retail prices of both thalapath and hurulla have decreased by Rs.44.00/kg and the price ranges were Rs.850.00-1,400.00/kg and Rs.240.00-680.00/kg respectively. Furthermore prices of mora, salaya and

kelawalla have decreased by Rs.10.00/kg, Rs.8.00/kg and Rs.5.00/kg respectively and the prices ranged between Rs.550.00/kg and Rs.1,100.00/kg in mora, Rs.130.00/kg and Rs.320.00/kg in salaya and Rs.640.00/kg and Rs.1,200.00/kg in kelawalla.



Meanwhile, price of shrimps has increased by Rs.20.00/kg, and the price range was Rs.950.00/kg and Rs.1,400.00/kg.

Compared to the same period of last year, current retail prices of most fresh fish types have increased in the range of 1%-32% and the highest price increase was reported for shrimp.

Dried Fish

Wholesale

Prices of most of the dried fish types have decreased due to increased local and imported stocks. The highest price decrease of 11% was noted for imported balaya and the price ranged between Rs.250.00/kg and Rs.320.00/kg. The second highest price decrease of 10% was noted for local balaya and the price ranged between Rs.300.00-340.00/kg. Further, price of imported sprats has decreased by 6%. In addition, prices of

local and imported maduwa, mora, local sprats, thora and salaya have decreased by less than 4%. Meanwhile, of price increased dried fish types, a 3% price increase was noted for local and imported anguluwa and the price ranged between Rs.750.00/kg and Rs.850.00/kg in local anguluwa and Rs.750.00/kg and Rs.800.00/kg in imported anguluwa. In addition, price of imported thora has increased by 2%. Further, prices of local and imported kattawa have increased but its not a significant change.

Compared to the same period of last year, current wholesale prices of most dried fish types have increased in the range of 2%-9%, and the highest price increase was noted for local sprats.

Retail

Retail prices of most of dried fish types have decreased during this week. The highest price decrease was reported for maduwa as Rs.75.00/kg and the price ranged between Rs.800.00/kg and Rs.900.00/kg. The second highest price decrease of Rs.59.00/kg was reported for local sprats, and the price ranged between Rs.1,000.00/kg and Rs.1,800.00/kg. In addition, prices of mora and balaya have decreased by Rs.35.00/kg and Rs.33.00/kg respectively, and the prices ranged between Rs.850.00/kg and Rs.1,400.00/kg in mora and Rs.550.00/kg and Rs.1,100.00/kg in balaya. Furthermore, prices of salaya and imported sprats have decreased by Rs.28.00/kg and Rs.16.00/kg respectively

and their price ranges were Rs.400.00-800.00/kg and Rs.550.00-900.00/kg respectively.

Meanwhile, of price increased dried fish types, retail price of thora has increased by Rs.50.00/kg, and the price range was Rs.1,300.00-2,000.00/kg. Further prices of anguluwa and kattawa have increased by Rs.41.00/kg and Rs.13.00/kg respectively and ranges were Rs.900.00-1,300.00/kg for anguluwa and Rs.900.00-1,500.00/kg for kattawa.

Compared to the same period of last year, current retail prices of all the dried fish types except balaya have increased in the range of 4%-32%, and the highest price increase was reported for imported sprats.

Eggs

Wholesale

Prices of both brown and white eggs have decreased by 8% and 11% respectively due to sufficient farm supply. The price range of a brown egg was Rs.10.50-11.50, and the price range of a white egg was Rs.9.00-10.00.

Compared to the same period of last year, current wholesale prices of both brown and white eggs have decreased by 19% and 28%, respectively.

Retail

Retail prices of both brown and white eggs have decreased by Rs.2.00/egg during this week. Price of a brown egg ranged between Rs.12.00 and Rs.16.00, and the lowest price

was reported from Nugegoda, Thotalanga and Pettah markets, while the highest price was reported from Kiribathgoda market. Price of a white egg ranged between Rs.10.00 and Rs.15.00, and the lowest price was reported from Pettah market, while the highest price was reported from Kiribathgoda market. Price of white egg ranged between Rs.10.00 and Rs.15.00, and the lowest price was reported from Pettah market, while the highest price was reported from Kiribathgoda market.

Compared to the same period of last year, current retail prices of both white and brown eggs have decreased by 23% and 19% respectively.

Meat

Retail

Prices of all meat types except beef and pork have decreased. The highest price decrease was reported for mutton as Rs.12.00/kg, and the price ranged between Rs.1,700.00/kg and Rs.1,900.00/kg. The second highest price decrease of Rs.11.00/kg was reported for broiler chicken, and the price ranged between Rs.400.00/kg and Rs.580.00/kg. Furthermore, price of curry chicken has decreased by Rs.1.00/kg, and the price ranged between Rs.400.00/kg and Rs.560.00/kg.

Meanwhile, prices of beef and pork have not changed during this week and the price ranged were Rs.900.00-1,000.00/kg and Rs.450.00-650.00/kg respectively.

Compared to the same period of last year, current retail prices of all meat types except beef and mutton have decreased, and the highest price decrease was reported for broiler chicken as 16%.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Food Commodities Bulletin is a weekly publication containing information relating to wholesale and retail prices of selected food commodities in nine selected markets in and around Colombo and main markets in the major producing areas.

The information is analyzed and presented as prevailing prices, price ranges, averages and comparison of weekly prices. The changes in prices reported are always in relation to price prevailed during the previous week unless otherwise stated.

The frequency of collection of wholesale price information is twice a week (i.e. Tuesday and Friday) while with retail prices, it is thrice a week (i.e. Friday, Monday and Tuesday)
