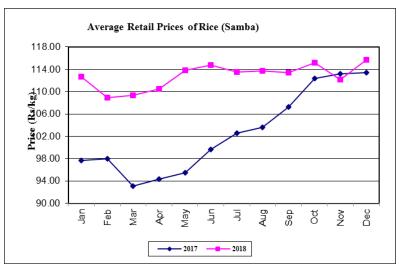

RICE:

Prices of all the rice varieties have increased slightly in December compared to the previous month. Retail price of samba grade I ranged between Rs.110.00-125.00/kg.

VEGETABLES:

Harvesting vegetables in *Maha* season started slightly in advance and the stocks started to reach the market by the mid of December. It was due to the prevailed favorable weather condition and early cultivation in Badulla and Kandy districts. Hence, stocks of vegetables in major markets have increased leading to a price drop. The highest price decrease of Rs.86.00/kg was reported for carrot followed by beans (Rs.74.00/kg). Prices are expected to further decrease during next month too.





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EXPLANTATORY NOTE

The Food Information Bulletin is a monthly publication containing information relating to producer, wholesale and retail prices of selected food commodities in selected markets in and around Colombo and main markets in the major producing areas. Data on extent, production and imports are also available in the bulletin.

The information is analyzed and presented as, prevailing prices, price ranges, averages and comparison of monthly prices. The changes in prices reported are always in relation to price, which prevailed during the previous month unless otherwise stated.

1. Paddy

Crop Situation

Despite the flood situation at the beginning of this month, paddy production outlook of 2018/19 *Maha* season remains satisfactory due to the favorable weather conditions and availability of irrigation water combined with the fertilizer subsidy. Flood incidents damaged around 42,000 ha of cultivated land in Northern and Eastern province during early December. According to the latest assessment made by the Department of Agriculture, the targeted extent of paddy lands in 2018/19 *Maha* season was 828,455 ha of which 743,314 ha (or 89% of the target) was cultivated by the end of December. The extent of land cultivated with paddy is 10% higher than that of the average extent of land cultivated with paddy over last three *Maha* seasons. The expected production based on the extent of land cultivated with paddy by the end of December is 2.85 Million Mt (1.8 million tons, milled basis) considering the crop damages. The major surplus of paddy is expected from Eastern and North Central provinces. The first harvest is expected to reach the market from the latter part of the January from Batticaloa.

Producer Prices

The prices of long grain white and long grain red paddy have shown an increasing trend in all considered major producing areas due to gradual reduction of market supply of paddy. Meanwhile, the prices of short grain paddy varieties have increased all considered major producing areas except Dehiattakandiya and Ampara. Prices of long grain white paddy have increased by less than 13% in all considered major producing areas with the highest increase from Kurunegala. Meanwhile, the prices of long grain red paddy have increased by less than 6% in Embilipitiya and 4% in Hambantota. The prices of long grain white and short grain in most of the major producing areas were in the range of Rs.40.00-48.00/kg and Rs.50.00-55.00/kg respectively. Prices of long grain red paddy were in the range of Rs.37.00-41.00/kg in producing areas in the Southern Province. It is expected that the increasing trend of paddy prices will be continuing during the next month due to short supply of paddy. When the new harvest reaches the markets and price drop can be expected by the end of next month.

Compared to the same period of last year, all the paddy varieties have shown a declining trend in all considered producing areas. The prices of short grain have decreased by less than 11% with the highest decline from Anuradhapura. Prices of long grain white have decreased in the range of 15%-19% with the highest decline also from Anuradhapura. Meanwhile, the prices of long grain red have decreased by 16% in Hambantota and 20% in Embilipitiya.

Rice Demand and Supply Situation

Wholesale Prices

Supplies of all the rice varieties had decreased during this month due to offseason. Further, the demand of rice also had increased slightly at the end of the month due to the festive season. Hence, wholesale prices of all the local rice varieties had increased with the highest price increase of 5% for *Nadu* grade II. The average wholesale prices of *Samba* grade I and II were Rs.107.60/kg and Rs.99.58/kg respectively in December. Wholesale prices of *Samba* grade I and II had increased slightly less than 1%. Further, the wholesale prices of *Nadu* grade I and II ranged between Rs.88.00-90.00/kg and Rs.82.00-87.00/kg respectively. Average wholesale prices of *Nadu* I and II had increased by 3% and 5% compared to the previous month.

Meanwhile, the wholesale price of imported *Samba* ranged between Rs.140.00-145.00/kg and it had increased by 4% compared to the previous month.

Raw white rice had been imported from Viet Nam, Pakistan, India and China during this month. The average CIF price of imported raw white rice was Rs.70.07/kg. A quantity of 4,295mt of all the varieties of rice had been imported during December 2018. The total expenditure on importing rice in December was Rs.513.5 million. Sri Lanka had imported a quantity of 752,177 mt of rice during the year 2017. It had dropped remarkably to 249,536mt in the year 2018.

Compared to the same period of last year, wholesale prices of all the local rice varieties have decreased with the highest price decrease of 13% for raw red. Meanwhile, the wholesale price of imported *Samba* had increased by 87% compared to the same period of last year.

Retail Prices

In line with the wholesale prices, retail prices of all the local rice varieties have increased in the range of 0.45-2.74%. Retail price of *Samba* grade I ranged between Rs.110.00-125.00/kg. The highest price increase of 2.74% was recorded for raw white. Further, retail prices of *Nadu* grade I and II have increased slightly by less than 1%. Imported *Samba* rice was available at retail level and price ranged between Rs.145.00 and Rs.170.00/kg.

Compared to the same period of last year, retail prices of all the local rice varieties have decreased with the highest price decrease of 13% for *Nadu* grade II. Meanwhile, retail price of imported *Samba* has increased by 78% compared to the same period of last year.

2. Other Field Crops

2.1 Chilli

Crop Situation

The targeted extent of chilli in *Maha* 2018/19 was about 10,765 ha of which 5,780 ha has been achieved by the end of December 2018. That was 54% of the target in Sri Lanka. Both the highest targeted extent of land (3,114 ha) and cultivated extent of land (1,242 ha) were reported from Anuradhapura district by the end of December 2018. Green chilli cultivation progress in Monaragala district was also in a satisfactory level. Out of the total expected production of green chilli (28,015 mt) was 60% which comprises 22% from Anuradhapura, 20% from Monaragala and 18% from Puttalam districts.

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The highest producer price for green chilli was reported from Embilipitiya and it ranged between Rs.408.00 and Rs. 503.00/kg. Supply of green chilli from Anuradhapura, Puttalam, Moneragala had decreased during this month. Hence, both wholesale and retail prices of green chilli were Rs.400.00/kg and Rs.608.87/kg respectively and those prices are higher than that of the wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chillies. Compared to the same period of last year, wholesale price of green chilli has increased by about 13% while the retail price has decreased by about 6%.

A quantity of 5,149 mt of dried chilli was imported from India during this month and it was an increase of 1,129 mt compared to that of the previous month. The average CIF price was Rs.236.59/kg and it was an increase of Rs.11.30/kg compared to last month. However, both wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chilli have increased by about Rs.12.00/kg and Rs.2.00/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of last year, both wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chillies have increased by about 31% and 23% respectively.

2.2 Big Onion and Red Onion

Crop situation

The targeted extent of land of red onion for *Maha* 2018/19 was 3,904 ha of which 1,652ha has been cultivated by the end of December 2018, which was 42% of the targeted extent of land in Sri Lanka. The targeted extent of land cultivated with big onion was about 1,900 ha in Jaffna and 1,020 ha of the target (about 54% of the target) was grown at the end of December 2018. The extent of land cultivated with red onion was around 51% of the target in Jaffna district during this month. The total expected production of red onion is 23,725 Mt and 93% of that production is expected from Jaffna (52%) and Puttalam (41%) districts.

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Only imported big onion stocks were available at the market during this month. A quantity of 23,169 Mt of big onion was imported from India (92%) and Pakistan (8%) during this month and it was an increase of 4,510 mt compared to the previous month. Average CIF price was Rs.44.91/kg for imported big onion and it had decreased by Rs.2.73/kg compared to that of last month. With the high imports from India, both wholesale and retail prices of imported big onion have decreased by about Rs.22.00/kg and Rs.17.00/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of last year, current wholesale and retail prices of imported big onion have decreased by about 41% and 35% respectively.

Supply of sinnan red onion from major producing areas has increased slightly during this month. Hence, wholesale price of sinnan red onion has decreased by about Rs.31.00/kg. However, stocks of local red onion still were not available at most of the wholesale and retail markets, during this month.

A quantity of 2,166 mt of red onion was imported from India during this month and it was an increase of 822 mt compared to last month. Average CIF price was Rs.100.17/kg for imported red onion and it has decreased by Rs.13.29/kg compared to previous month. Both wholesale and retail prices of imported red onion have decreased by about Rs.20.00/kg. Compared to the same period of last year, current wholesale and retail prices of imported red onion have decreased by about 66% and 59% respectively.

2.3 Potato

Crop Situation and Progress

The targeted extent of potato for *Maha* 2018/19 was 2,964 ha of which about 1,265 ha had been cultivated by the end of this month achieving 43% of the target. During this month about 754 ha of potato was cultivated in the country. According to the cultivated extent of land up to end of this month, the expected production of potato was 20,767 mt for this *Maha* season.

In the Nuwara Eliya district, the targeted extent of land was 1,323 ha of which about 383 ha of potato have been cultivated by the end of this month achieving 29% progress. Compared to the same period of last *Maha* season, the cultivated extent was at high level during this *Maha* season in the district due to availability of sufficient stocks of imported seeds. During this month, about 162 ha of potatoes were cultivated in Nuwara Eliya.

The targeted extent for this *Maha* season is 1,502 ha in the Badulla district and 838 ha have been cultivated by the end of December achieving 56% of the targeted extent of land. The cultivated extent of land during this season was slightly at a low level compared to the same period of last *Maha* season in the district. In December, about 552 ha of extent of lands were cultivated with potatoes in Badulla. As the *Yala* harvesting of potato was over by November, the supply of Welimada potato was lower in December.

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

A quantity of 17,372 mt of potato had been imported in December which was 6,691mt higher than that was imported during the previous month as the Special Commodity Levy for imported potato has been reduced up to Rs.20.00/kg with effect from 03/12/2018. Imported stocks were mainly received from Pakistan (67%) and India (29%). Compared to December, 2017 (17,902 mt), the imports were low during this month. Average CIF price was Rs.45.00/kg in December.

With regard to local potato, the supply has dropped due to end of the peak harvesting season in major producing areas. Stocks of Welimada potato were not available in the market. Hence, the wholesale and retail prices of Nuwara Eliya potatoes have increased further by 3% and 10% respectively in December. On average, the producer price of Nuwara Eliya potato was Rs.133.00/kg. Wholesale and retail prices of imported potato have decreased by 6% and 1% respectively due to decreased tax for imported potato. During December, the wholesale prices of Nuwara Eliya and imported potatoes ranged between Rs.140.00 and Rs. 155.00/kg, and Rs.50.00 and Rs.115.00/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of Nuwara Eliya (24%) and imported (21%) potatoes have increased. Prices of potatoes were

expected to be increased further till February as the new harvesting will be commenced in February from Badulla district.

2.4 Green gram and Cowpea Crop Situation and Progress

Green gram cultivation has been achieved around 40% of its targeted extent of land in *Maha* 2018/2019 season. According to the table 2.4.1, the extent of land cultivated with green gram has declined by 2,793 ha (46% compared with *Maha* 2017/2018) in Sri Lanka compared with the extent of land cultivated with green gram in last year. The extents of lands cultivated with green gram in this month have declined by more than 52% in Hambantota, by 15% in Monaragala and by 5% in Kurunegala compared to those of the previous year. According to the crop damages, the production from the island-wide green gram cultivation is expected as 4,353 mt which is around half of the green gram production of the previous year.

It was able to achieve 35% of the targeted extent of land cultivated with cowpea, which would be expected around 4,151 mt. When the extent of cowpea production in 2018/19 *Maha* season was considered, Ampara, Monaragala and Anuradhapura districts were the major cowpea producing districts which contributed to 44% of the total production in the country. Monaragala and Anuradhapura districts were highlighted better performance while Ampara district progress was 5% of its targets.

Prices and Supply Demand Situation

The wholesale price of green gram ranged between Rs.225/kg and Rs.235/kg with an average of Rs.229.90/kg in December 2018. The average price has increased by 10% compared to the previous month. Similarly, compared to the same period of last year, the wholesale price has increased by 16%. In the meantime, the retail price of green gram ranged between Rs.240/kg and Rs.280/kg with an average of Rs.255.55/kg. Compared to the previous month, the retail price has increased by Rs. 5.89/kg. However, compared to the same period of last year, the retail price for this month has increased to around 5%.

Average wholesale prices of white and red cowpea were recorded as Rs.225.27/kg and Rs.217.48/kg respectively in December 2018. The wholesale price of white cowpea ranged between Rs.215/kg and Rs.235/kg, and that of red cowpea ranged between Rs.175/kg and Rs.225/kg. Compared to the previous month, the wholesale price of white cowpea has increased by 5% while the price of red cowpea has increased by 7%. Compared to the same period of last year, the wholesale price of white has increased by 2% while red cowpea has decreased by 10 percent. Meanwhile, average retail prices of white and red cowpea were recorded as Rs.278.22/kg

and Rs.285.30/kg respectively. The retail price of white cowpea ranged between Rs.240/kg and Rs.320/kg, and that of red cowpea also ranged between Rs.230/kg and Rs.320/kg. Compared to the previous month, the prices of both white cowpea and red cowpea have not changed significantly. Compared to the same period of last year, retail prices of white and red cowpea have decreased by 4% and 6% respectively.

A total quantity of 1,034 mt of green gram has been imported during this month and it is an increase of 28% compared to the green gram quantity imported in the previous month. The average CIF price of a kilogram of a green gram was Rs.150.30/kg while the retail price has increased by 2% compared with the previous month. The total expenditure of the importation of green gram was recorded as Rs.155.43 million which has increased by 29% of the total value spent on green gram importation in the previous month. Green gram has been imported from several counties where were Argentina (26%), Kenya (25%), Myanmar (23%), South Africa (17%), Uzbekistan (9%) and Australia (0.1%).

According to table 2.4.4, a total quantity of 614 MT of white cowpea has been imported during this month. The imported quantity of cowpea has decreased by 17% compared to the previous month. The average CIF price of kilograms of white cowpea was recorded as Rs.115.14/kg. The total expenditure on cowpea imports has decreased by 15% compared to the previous month expenditure. The total value of the cowpea imports was noted as approximately Rs.70 million. The highest quantity of cowpea was imported from Madagascar (33%), India (31%) and the rest was imported from Myanmar (15%), Portugal (12%), Brazil (8%) and Australia (1%).

Monthly distribution of imported quantities of the green gram and cowpea are shown in figure 4.1. Accordingly, the highest quantity of green gram was imported in August and that of cowpea was imported in October. However, 16,425 mt of green gram, worth Rs. 2,238 million, has been imported and 8,100 mt of cowpea, worth Rs. 994.75 million was imported in 2018.

2.5 Red dhal

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The wholesale price of red dhal ranged between Rs.108/kg and Rs.115/kg with an average of Rs.110.25/kg, and the retail price ranged between Rs.120/kg and Rs.140.00/kg with an average of Rs.127.19/kg. Moreover, the difference between the two prices is Rs.17/kg during this month. Compared to wholesale and retail prices of the same period of last year, wholesale and retail prices have decreased by 2.5% and 6.8% respectively.

During this month, a total quantity of 16,510 mt of red dhal has been imported at an average CIF price of Rs.81.21/kg and CIF price has increased by 7 percent compared to this CIF price of the previous month. Of the total red dhal quantity, the largest quantity (i.e., 14,861 mt) was of the whole type while the rest (i.e., 1,648 mt) was of the split type. Whole type red dhal was imported as 57% from Australia, 41% from Canada and 2% from India. The total value of the whole type of red dhal imported was Rs. 1,158 million and average CIF price was Rs.77.91 per kilo. Split type red dhal has been imported mainly from Canada (94%) and India (6%). The average CIF price of split type was Rs.111 per kilo and the total value of split type imported was Rs.183 million.

3. Vegetables

Crop Situation

In most of vegetable producing areas, a favorable weather condition prevailed. Hence, the cultivation of 2018/19 *Maha* season continued as usual in major producing areas. Although rainy weather condition prevailed in Badulla district, it has not affected the cultivation. However, unfavorable rainy weather condition that prevailed in Dambulla has caused the vegetable cultivation delayed. Therefore, only 40% of the targeted extent of land has been cultivated with vegetables by the end of December. The extent of land cultivated with vegetables in this December was 24% lower than that in the previous year December.

Of the targeted extent of lands for upcountry vegetable cultivation, about 57% had been cultivated by the end of December. Extents of lands cultivated with beans, cabbage, capsicum, and carrot were 2,528 ha, 1,320 ha, 1,154 ha, 1,072 ha respectively. Therefore, the expected production of upcountry vegetables was 131,917 mt by the end of December. Further, expected productions of beans, cabbage, capsicum and carrot were 26,514 mt, 34,945 mt, 9,259 mt and 14,158 mt respectively. Low country vegetables have been cultivated in about 55% of the targeted extent of lands by the end of December. Among the low country vegetables, pumpkin, brinjal, okra and tomato were mainly cultivated in 2,825 ha, 2,930 ha, 2,402 ha and 1,653 ha respectively. The expected total production of low country vegetables was about 174,131 mt. The expected productions of pumpkin, tomato, okra and brinjal were 37,740 mt, 24,483 mt, 22,858 mt and 35,116 mt respectively. The production of 2018/19 *Maha* season will reach to the market until March and April (HARTI field information network/ Crop Forecast Department of Agriculture).

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Prices of most of vegetable varieties have come down during this month as the harvest of 2018/19 *Maha* season have started to reach to the main markets by the mid of December. With regard to upcountry vegetables, wholesale prices have dropped by a percentage of 11% to 40%. The highest price decrease was reported as 40% for carrot. However, the price of beetroot has further increased by 5% because of limited stocks available in the market. The wholesale prices of low country vegetables have also decreased by 4% to 59%. The highest price decrease was noted as 59% for long beans. Compared to vegetable prices of December last year, the price of upcountry vegetables had decreased by 1% to 43% while that of low country vegetables had decreased by 7% to 68%. Meanwhile tomato prices had increased by 125%.

Retail prices of vegetable also have declined during this month. Among upcountry vegetables, the highest price decrease was reported as Rs.86.00/kg for carrot while the lowest price decrease was reported as Rs.7.00/kg for leeks. Meanwhile, the price of beans has decreased by Rs.74.00/kg. Of low country vegetable prices, the highest price drop was reported as Rs.59.00/kg for long beans while the lowest price decrease was reported as Rs.6.00/kg for ash plantain. Further, the price of lime had decreased by Rs.189.00/kg. However, the price of green chilli has further increased by Rs.191.00/kg. According to the seasonal price index, generally, the prices are expected to increase from November to December. However, the reverse was observed in this year due to following reasons. One was the favourable weather condition for vegetable cultivation in major vegetable producing areas which resulted in supply of vegetables after the mid of December. Other reason was that the cultivation of this *Maha* season in Kandy (Marassana) and Badulla was in advance of about one month and the production of those crops arrived to the market after the mid of December. The price drop is further expected during next month too. Compared to prices of the same period of last year, the prices of most vegetables have decreased by a range between 1% to

31%. Nevertheles, the prices of tomato, carrot, and knolkhol have increased by 101%, 18% and 6% respectively while that of lime increased by 243%.

4. Fruits

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Compared to the prices in November, wholesale prices of most of the fruit varieties had increased in December with the high consumer demand during the festive season. Prices of all the banana varieties except Anamalu had increased in the range of 3%-6% and prices of Seeni Ambul and Kolikuttu had increased by 6%, 5% and 3% respectively and price ranges recorded during the month were Rs.50.00-80.00/kg, Rs.30.00-80.00/kg and Rs.100.00-160.00/kg respectively. In addition, price of Ambun had increased by 4% and price was Rs.15.00-22.00/fruit. However, a price decrease of 1% was noted for banana variety, Anamalu and the price range recorded was Rs.10.00-18.00/fruit. Prices of small, medium and large sized pineapple had increased by 4% and the monthly average wholesale prices of small, medium and large sized fruits were Rs.79.87/fruit, Rs.114.33/fruit and Rs.149.20/fruit respectively and the price ranged between Rs.50.00 and 180.00/fruit. Further, price of mango variety, Betti had increased by 22% and price range recorded for a fruit was Rs.18.00 - 22.00. Price of papaw had increased significantly by 97% and the monthly average wholesale price was Rs.142.80/kg, and the price ranged between Rs.120.00-170.00/kg. In addition, 76% and 28% price increases were noted for avocado and orange respectively. Further, prices of wood apple and imported grapes had increased by 20% and 14% respectively.

However, prices of mango varieties, Vilad, Karthakolomban and Kohu had decreased by 28%, 27% and 14% respectively. Price range recorded for a Karthakolomban fruit was Rs.25.00-40.00. In addition, prices of passion fruit and slime apple had decreased by 26% and 12% respectively.

According to the data in the previous years, prices of fruit varieties, papaw, passion fruit, wood apple, avocado, orange and all the banana varieties except Kolikuttu are expected to be increased in the coming month while, prices of pineapple, mango and slime apple are expected to be decreased.

Compared to the same period of 2017, wholesale prices of most of the fruit varieties had increased with the highest price increase of 72% for both papaw and passion fruit.

In line with the increased wholesale prices, prices of most of the fruit varieties had increased at the retail level too. Prices of all the banana varieties had increased in the range of 2%-6%. Price ranges of banana varieties, Ambul, Kolikuttu and Seeni were noted as Rs.60.00-150.00/kg, Rs.160.00-250.00/kg and Rs.80.00-140.00/kg respectively. Further, prices of banana varieties, Anamalu and Ambun ranged between Rs.15.00-23.00/fruit and Rs.18.00-25.00/fruit respectively. Price of mango variety, Vilad had increased by 12% and price of a fruit was noted as Rs.30.00-60.00. Price of papaw had increased significantly by 64% compared to the previous month and the price ranged between Rs.150.00-260.00/kg. Similarly, price of avocado had also increased significantly by 120% and price of a fruit was noted as Rs.70.00-250.00. In addition, prices of orange and imported grapes had increased by 24% and 5% respectively.

However, prices of small and large sized pineapple had decreased by 8% while, price of medium sized pineapple had decreased by 6%. Further, price range recorded for pineapple was Rs.60.00-260.00/fruit. Price of mango variety, Karthakolomban had decreased by 26% and price of a fruit was noted as Rs.35.00-100.00. In addition, prices of passion fruit and slime apple had decreased by 18% and 11% respectively.

Compared to the same period of 2017, retail prices of most of the fruit varieties too, had increased and the highest price increase was noted for avocado as 95%.

With reference to the producer prices, producers had received decreased prices for banana varieties, Ambul and Kolikuttu and an increased price for papaw compared to the prices in November, 2018. Further, the prices had decreased by 17% and 13% for Kolikuttu and Ambul respectively and it was a 51% of price increase for papaw. Producer prices for Ambul, Kolikuttu and papaw ranged between Rs.22.50-45.00/kg, Rs.45.00-145.00/kg and Rs.37.50 - 100.60/kg respectively. At the same time, compared to producer price in December, 2017, producer prices had increased for papaw significantly by 53% and for Kolikuttu by 9% and it was a price decrease for Ambul by 20% (Table 4.3).

Exports/Imports of Fruits

According to the Sri Lanka Customs, Sri Lanka had exported 714 mt of fresh fruits in December, 2018 to the value of Rs.98 mn. Of the exported quantity, 85% were papaw, 9% were fresh mangoes and 6% were fresh pineapple. Further, one metric ton of fresh avocados also had been exported and it was less than 1% of the total exported quantity of fruits in this month. In the month of November, 2018, the quantity exported was 895 mt. Therefore, compared to last month, the exported quantity had decreased by 20%.

With reference to imports, Sri Lanka had imported 3,047 mt of fresh fruits, worth Rs.568 mn, during this month. Of the imported quantity, apple, grapes and oranges were 76%, 16% and 8%. The main apple importing countries included China, France, the United States and Italy. Grapes had been imported from China, India and the United States. South Africa, Australia and Egypt were the main oranges importing countries. In the month of November, 2018, the quantity imported was 4,001 mt. Therefore, compared to the fruit imports of last month, the imported quantity had decreased by 24%.

5. Fish, Dried Fish, Eggs and Meat

Fish

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Average wholesale prices of selected fresh fish ranged between Rs.100.00/kg and Rs.1200.00/kg during December. The supply of fresh fish decreased during this month and the market prices increased. Therefore, when we compare the prices with last month wholesale market prices, all the fresh fish prices have increased except for Thora. The highest price increase was observed with regard to Salaya and it was 17%. Increase of other fish prices were 15% for Paraw, 10% for Balaya, 9% for Mora, 9% for Hurulla, 8% for Small Shrimp and 2% for Thalapath. The only price decrease reported was 3% for Thora. However, compared to the same period of last year, wholesale prices of most fresh fish types have decreased by 17% - 0.5%. Thus, Price for Balaya has increased compared to last year prices.

Average retail prices of selected fresh fish types ranged between Rs.160.00/kg and Rs.2000.00/kg during this month. Consumers had to pay between Rs.230.00 and Rs.1495.00 to purchase a kilo of any type of fresh fish. Retail prices of most fresh fish types showed an increase (except for Thora) compared to last month fish prices. The highest price increase was observed in Balaya (20%) and the lowest increment was observed in small Shrimps (4%). However, price for Thora declined by 0.74% in this month.

Dried Fish

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Average wholesale prices of selected dried fish types ranged between Rs.200.00 /kg and Rs.1250.00 /kg during December. Compared to previous month, prices of most dried fish types had fluctuated. The highest price increase was observed for imported Balaya as 51%, and the lowest price increase was observed for imported Anguluwa as 0.31%. At the same time prices of Salaya, local Balaya, Local Thora, Sprats, imported Sprats, local Anguluwa, Maduwa and, local and imported Mora increased by 24%, 13%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 3%, 3% and 1% respectively. In the meantime, price of imported Thora, imported Kattawa imported Maduwa and local Kattawa have decreased by 4%, 4%, 2% and 1% respectively during December.

Average retail prices of selected dried fish types ranged between 500.00/kg and Rs.2000.00 /kg during this month. However, compared to previous month, retail prices of most dried fish types have increased by 0.22% to 8%. The highest price increase was observed for local Maduwa as 8%, and the lowest price increase was observed for local Mora by 0.22%. The only retail price decline was reported with regard to local Kattawa by 0.4%. Compared to the same period last year, prices of all dried fish types (except Salaya) have increased by 1% - 7%.

Eggs

Wholesale prices of brown and white eggs have increased by 20% to 21%, respectively. Christmas and the festive season of the end of year could be one of the reasons for this price increase during this month. However, Price of a brown egg ranged between Rs.17.50 and Rs.20.00, whilst that of a white egg ranged between Rs.16.50 and Rs.19.00. Compared to the same period of last year, prices of brown and white eggs have increased by 38% and 41% respectively.

Retail prices of a brown egg ranged between Rs.18.00 and Rs. 22.00, and that of a white egg ranged between Rs.17.00 and Rs. 21.00 during this month. Average prices of brown and white eggs were recorded as Rs. 20.57 and Rs. 19.54, respectively. Compared to the previous month, prices of brown and white eggs have increased by 19% and 20%, respectively. Similarly, compared to the same period of last year, prices of brown and white eggs have increased by 34% and 36%, respectively.

Meat

Prices of all types of meat have increased during this month. The highest meat price observed in Mutton and it was Rs.1855.00, and the lowest price observed in Broiler chicken and it was Rs.549.00 per kilo. Furthermore, compared to all meat prices of previous month, this month prices have increased as broiler price by 8% (reported highest meat price increment during this month), pork price by 1%, mutton price by 0.4%, beef price by 0.3% and curry chicken price by 0.1%. However, compared to previous year prices of all types of meat had increased significantly. The highest price increase was noted for pork and it was recorded as 38%.

6. Wheat grain, Wheat flour and Sugar

Wheat grain, Wheat flour

A total quantity of 139,382 mt of wheat grain, worth of 6,653 mn had been imported during December 2018. Compared to quantity imported in the previous month, quantity imported in this month has increased and the latter was nearly one and half times of the former. Wheat grain for December had been mainly imported from Canada (76%) and the CIF price was Rs.49.00/kg. Second and third highest wheat grain quantities were imported from Pakistan (17,123 mt.) and United States (12,000 mt) respectively. In addition, wheat grain had been imported from Australia (2%). Few quantities were also imported from India and Russia as well. The CIF price of wheat grain ranged between Rs.40.00 and 66.00/kg and the average CIF price was recorded as Rs.48.00/kg. Compared to the previous month, average CIF price for wheat grain has increased only by Rs.1.00/kg. The highest CIF price was reported for the Indian wheat grain stock whilst, the lowest recorded for Russian stocks.

A total quantity of 1,385 mt of wheat flour, worth of 103 mn, had been imported during December 2018. Compared to quantity imported in the previous month, quantity imported in this month has drastically increased and the latter was nearly two and half times of the former. The highest quantity of wheat flour for this month had been imported from India (43%) and the CIF price was Rs.80.00/kg. Further, wheat flour had been imported from Pakistan (7%) and Germany (1%) as well. In addition, few quantities were also imported from China, Singapore and Italy. The CIF price for wheat flour for December ranged between Rs.45.00 and Rs. 101.00/kg and the average CIF was Rs.74.00/kg. Compared to CIF price of the previous month, average CIF price for wheat flour has increased by Rs.3.00/kg. The highest CIF price was reported for the German wheat flour stock whilst, the lowest recorded for the China stocks.

Meanwhile, the local retail price of wheat flour ranged between Rs.87.00 and Rs. 100.00/kg and the average price was Rs.94.00/kg. The average retail price of wheat flour remained unchanged during this month. Further, compared to retail price of the same period of last year, retail price of wheat flour has increased by 5%.

Sugar

A total quantity of 59,943 mt of sugar, worth of 3,626 mn, had been imported to the country during this month. Compared to the previous month, quantity of this month has increased by more than one and half times in terms of quantity. Sugar for this month had been mainly imported from India (91%) and CIF price was Rs.60.00/kg. The second highest quantity of sugar was imported from Thailand (8%). In addition, few quantities were also imported from United Arab Emirates and Korea. The CIF prices ranged between Rs.60.00 and Rs. 95.00/kg and the average CIF price was reported as Rs.60.00/kg. The average CIF price has increased only by Rs.1.00/kg during this month. The highest CIF price was paid for sugar imported from Korea, while the lowest for that from India.

With regard to local retail price of sugar for December, price ranged between Rs.98.00 and Rs. 120.00/kg and the average retail price was Rs.108.00/kg. Average retail price for sugar remained unchanged during this month. Further, compared to the same period of last year average retail price of sugar has decreased by 4%.
