Highlights

Rice


Producer prices for short grain, long grain white, and long grain red have decreased compared to the previous month, with the most significant price decrease observed for long grain red paddy in all major producing areas. Producer prices for Keeri Samba paddy varieties continued on an upward trend in all producing areas, ranging from Rs. 130.00-144.00/kg. Supplies of local rice varieties, including Samba, Nadu, raw red, and raw white, increased during the month, particularly for raw red. The most substantial wholesale price reduction occurred in raw red rice, with prices ranging between Rs. 125.00-155.00/kg. Aligned with wholesale price trends, retail prices for all local rice varieties experienced a decrease, with the most significant drop of Rs. 9.49/kg noted in raw red rice. In a year-over-year comparison, retail prices for most rice varieties exhibited a decrease. The most notable reduction of 37% was observed for raw red rice, followed by a 30% decrease for raw white rice.

Vegetables

Due to limited supply during the off season prices of most of the vegetable varieties have increased. Retail prices of vegetables had increased by 1%-32%. Highest price increase was reported for carrots (32%). The highest price of Rs.890.00/kg was reported for drumsticks while the lowest price of Rs.175.00/kg was observed for pumpkin. In addition, price of green chilli has increased by 44%. However, vegetable prices tend to be decrease in the coming months.

Fish, Dried Fish, Eggs and Meat

Although food inflation was lower, the prices of most fish varieties have surged by less than 22% in both wholesale and retail markets due to low supply during the lean season for southern and western coastal belt. Corresponding to this supply drop, the average retail prices of both types of eggs have exceeded the stipulated maximum retail prices (MRP) for brown eggs at Rs. 46.00 and white eggs at Rs. 44.00.

1. Paddy/Rice

Crop Situation

According to the Department of Agriculture (DoA), the targeted paddy area for the Yala season in 2023 is 542,870 hectares. The sown extent reported as of the end of June 2023 is 484,437 hectares, achieving 89% of the set target. The sown area of paddy (484,437 hectares) in June 2023 reflects a 7% increase compared to the same period the previous year. The paddy production forecast, based on the reported sown extent as of the end of June 2023, is 1.81 million metric tons, accounting for crop losses.

According to the crop forecast by the DOA, the anticipated rice production for Yala 2023 is expected to be sufficient to meet the nation's needs until mid-January 2024.

Producer Prices

Producer prices for short grain, long grain white, and long grain red have decreased compared to the previous month, with a notable price decline for long grain red paddy in all major producing areas. The highest price decrease of 12% was recorded for long grain raw red paddy in the Matara area, followed by a 10% decrease in the Hambantota area. Producer prices of Keeri Samba paddy varieties are consistently on an upward trend in all producing areas, ranging from Rs. 130.00-144.00/kg, with the highest average price observed in Polonnaruwa.

Producer prices of short grain paddy have slightly decreased in all major producing areas, ranging between Rs. 90.00-111.00/kg, with the lowest average price observed in the Ampara area. Similarly, the producer prices of long grain white paddy have decreased in all major producing areas, ranging between Rs. 78.00-111.00/kg.

When comparing prices to the same period last year, there has been a reduction in producer prices for all paddy varieties excluding Keeri Samba, ranging from 14% to 48%. Notably, there has been a significant decrease in prices for long grain red paddy.

Rice Prices Demand/Supply Situation

Wholesale Prices

Supplies of local rice varieties, including Samba, Nadu, raw red, and raw white, increased during the month, particularly for raw red rice. Wholesale prices for Samba grade I and II ranged from Rs. 195.00-210.00 and Rs. 190.00-205.00/kg, respectively, reflecting a marginal decrease of less than 3% compared to the previous month. Similarly, wholesale prices for Nadu grade I and II ranged from Rs. 175.00-185.00 and Rs. 165.00-180.00/kg, respectively, indicating a 2% decrease. The most significant price reduction occurred in raw red rice, with prices ranging between Rs. 125.00-155.00/kg. The wholesale price of Keeri Samba decreased slightly by 1%; however, low supply was observed during the month.

Comparing current prices to the same period last year, wholesale prices for all local rice varieties have seen a decrease. The most substantial price decrease of 43% was observed for raw red rice, followed by a 35% decrease for raw white rice.

Retail Prices

In line with wholesale price trends, retail prices for all local rice varieties have experienced a decrease, with the most notable drop of Rs. 9.49/kg observed in raw red rice. Retail prices for Samba grade I and II now range from Rs. 220.00-240.00 and Rs. 200.00-230.00/kg, respectively, reflecting a slight 1% decrease compared to the previous month. Additionally, retail prices for Nadu grade I and II range between Rs. 210.00-230.00 and Rs. 180.00-210.00/kg, respectively,

remaining relatively stable compared to the previous month. Notably, retail prices of raw red and raw white rice stand out among other local rice varieties due to a 5% and 4% decrease, respectively, compared to the previous month.

In a year-over-year comparison, retail prices for most rice varieties have exhibited a decrease. The most significant reduction of 37% was observed for raw red rice, followed by a 30% decrease for raw white rice.

2. Other Field Crops

2.1 Chilli

Crop Situation and Progress

The targeted extent of green chilli of Yala, in 2023 was 9,728 ha and by the end of June 2023, 3,541 ha have been cultivated representing 36% of the targeted extent. Crops are in different stages in the main producing areas. In the Puttalam district, only about 270 ha have been cultivated at the end of June representing 20% of the targeted extent. According to the cultivated extent up to the end of this month, the expected production of green chilli is 19,911 Mt for this Yala season in the country with 49% of the supply from Puttalam (13%), Anuradhapura (8%), Mahaweli areas (11%), Interprovincial DDA areas (9%) and Vavuniya (8%) areas.

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The supply of green chilli from main producing areas has decreased during this month. Hence, both wholesale and retail prices of green chilli have increased by about Rs.297.00/kg and Rs.217.00/kg respectively. Wholesale Prices of green chilli ranged between Rs.300.00-750.00/kg and Rs.400.00- 1000.00/kg at the retail level. Higher producer prices for green chilli were recorded from the Embilipitiya area with the price range of Rs.404.00 - 776.00/kg during the month of June. Compared to the same period of last year, wholesale price of green chilli has increased by 5% while the retail price has decreased by about 4%.

A quantity of 1,742 mt of dried chillie was imported in June 2023 and this quantity was lower than 2,285 mt compared to the previous month. The average CIF price was Rs.763.64/kg and it has not changed compared to the previous month. However, both wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chillies have decreased by about Rs.102.00/kg and Rs.58.00/kg respectively. Prices ranged between Rs.900.00-1150.00/kg at the wholesale level and Rs.1080.00 – Rs. 1500.00/kg at the retail level. Compared to the same period last year, both wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chilli have decreased by about 46% and 39% respectively.

2.2 Red Onion and Big Onion

Crop situation and Progress

The targeted extent of big onion cultivation was about 7,149 ha for 2023 Yala season and around 287 ha have been cultivated by the end of June 2023, which represent only about 4% of the targeted extent. Cultivation will be taken place until end of July,2023. In Matale district, targeted extent of big onion was 1597 ha and only 16 ha have been cultivated at the end of June 2023, which represent only 1% of the targeted extent. Though the highest cultivated extent was recorded from Mahaweli –H area at the end of this month, cultivation progress in all the producing areas was in a low level.

The targeted extent of red onion cultivation was 3910 ha for this Yala season and around 1,673 ha have been cultivated by the end of June 2023, which represent 43% of the targeted extent. The highest targeted extent (2000 ha) and the highest cultivated extent (1300 ha) were recorded from Jaffna district and it represents 65% of the targeted extent. The estimated production of this Yala season was 16,929 Mt and out of that 86% was supplied from Jaffna (71%) and Puttalam (15%) districts.

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Big onion market supplies totally comprised imports and this situation would continue until Yala harvesting begins in August. Nursery preparation of big onion has been started in Matale district and Yala cultivation will be commenced during the next month and cultivation will be taken largely during the month of July. A quantity of 28,435 mt of big onion was imported in June 2023 and this quantity was higher than 912 mt compared to the previous month. The average CIF price was Rs.57.41/kg and it has not changed significantly compared to the previous month. Wholesale price of imported big onion and has decreased by Rs.3.00/kg while the retail price has increased by about Rs.3.00/kg. The wholesale price of imported big onion ranged between Rs.60.00 – 115.00/kg while at the retail level it was recorded as Rs.115.00 – 260.00/kg. Compared to the same period of last year, both wholesale and retail prices of imported big onions have decreased by about 46% and 43% respectively.

The supply of Vedalan red onion from main producing areas has decreased during this month. Hence, wholesale price of vedalan has increased by about Rs.106.00/kg while local red onion varieties were not available at most of the retail markets.

A quantity of 1,031mt of red onion was imported from India during this month and it was a decrease of 260 mt compared to that of last month. The average CIF price was Rs.112.79/kg and it has increased by Rs.4.78/kg compared to the previous month. Both wholesale and retail prices

of imported red onions have increased by about Rs.74.00/kg and Rs.15.00/kg respectively due to limited imports. Compared to the same period of last year, wholesale price of imported red onion has increased by about 12% while the retail price has decreased by about 13%.

2.3 Potato

Crop Situation and Progress

The targeted extent of potato for Yala 2023 is 2,970 ha and about 320 ha were cultivated in the country by the end of June achieving 11% of the targeted extent. According to the cultivated extent up to end of June, the expected production of potato is 5,879 mt for this Yala season with 60% from Badulla and 40% from Nuwara Eliya respectively.

In the Nuwara Eliya district, the targeted extent is 946 ha for this Yala season and in the Badulla district, it was reported as 2,022 ha. In the Nuwara Eliya and Badulla districts, about 109 ha and 211 ha were cultivated by the end of this month achieving 12% and 10% of the targeted extents. In Badulla district most of the new cultivation has been commenced from this month. Compared to the same period of last The cultivated extents during this Yala season were at low than the three year average of monthly cultivated extent in both Nuwara Eliya and Badulla districts (DOA, 2023)

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Both local and imported stocks were available in the market. With regard to local potato, the supply of Welimada potato was at a low level due to end of the peak harvesting period. On average, the producer prices of Welimada and Nuwara Eliya potatoes were Rs.263.00/kg and Rs. 269.00/kg respectively in June. Wholesale prices of Nuwara Eliya and imported potatoes have increased by 10% and 6% respectively when compared to the previous month. Meanwhile, the retail prices of Nuwara Eliya and imported potatoes were ranged between Rs.300.00-440.00/kg and Rs.145.00-250.00/kg in Colombo and suburbs markets. During the month, the wholesale prices of Nuwara Eliya and imported potatoes ranged between Rs.250.00-320.00/kg and Rs.145.00-250.00/kg respectively. Supply of local potato will be low until mid-August and the prices of local potatoes are expected to be increased further in July.

2.4 Green gram and Cowpea

Crop Situation and Progress

Green gram cultivation has been achieved around 55% of its targeted extent as at end of June in *Yala* 2023 season. The expected production from the island-wide green gram cultivation is 6,247 mt. Kurunegala, Monaragala and Matale districts were the major cultivating districts in *Yala* 2023 for green gram. However, low progress was reported in Udawalawa and Hambantota. Green gram area depicts below normal cultivation extent during the entire months of 2023 yala, except June (DOA,2023).

It has been able to achieve only 36% of the targeted extent from cowpea cultivation and the expected production is around 5,133 mt in Sri Lanka. Ampara, Monaragala, Batticaloa and Vavuniya districts are the major producing areas in the 2023 *Yala* season. Cowpea and Black gram indicate below-normal cultivation during the entire months of Yala 2023(DOA 2023).

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The wholesale price of green gram ranged between Rs.850.00/kg and Rs. 1,250.00/kg with an average of Rs.1104.00/kg in June 2023. The average price has decreased by 29% compared to May 2023. Similarly, compared to the same period of last year, the wholesale price has been increased by 21%. The average retail price was Rs. 1,439.00/kg in June 2023 and it ranged between from Rs.850.00/kg to Rs.1,250.00/kg. The retail price has been decreased around 6% compared to the similar period of the last year.

Average wholesale prices of white and red cowpea were recorded as Rs.922.00/kg and Rs.913.00/kg in June 2023. The wholesale prices of white cowpea ranged between Rs.600.00/kg and Rs.700.00/kg. Compared to May 2022, the wholesale price of white cowpea has increased by 7% and red cowpea by 41%.

2.5 Red dhal

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The wholesale price of red dhal ranged between Rs.250.00/kg and Rs.280.00/kg with an average of Rs.260.00/kg. It has been reduced by 18% compared to May 2023. Nevertheless, there was a 56% price reduction in June compared with the same period of the previous year. Consumers in Sri Lanka had to pay Rs.310.00/kg for red dhal in June 2023. The retails price has been reduced around 52% compared to the same period of the previous year.

3. Vegetables

Crop Situation

Cultivation season of Yala 2023 is commenced and cultivation progress of up-country and low-country vegetables are recorded as 41% (7,405ha) and 66% (15,022ha) respectively. The targeted extent and production of up-country vegetables in this season are 17,912ha and 110,751mt respectively. For the low-country vegetables, 22,661ha of cultivation extent and 178,183mt production are expected. Tomato, ash plantain, pumpkin, okra, brinjal, luffa, long bean, winged bean and kekiri reported above 50% progress from the respective targets. (*Crop Forecast, Vol.03, Yala 2023, Socio-Economics & Planning Center/Department of Agriculture*).

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Due to limited supply during the off season prices of most of the vegetable varieties have increased. The wholesale prices of up-country vegetables have increased by 1%-56%. The highest price increase was reported for carrots (56%) due to limited supply from Nuwara Eliya areas. The highest price of Rs.404.00/kg was recorded for beans while the lowest price of Rs.138.00/kg was observed for radish. With regard to the low-country vegetables, the wholesale prices have increased by 4%-40% except brinjal, capsicum, snake gourd and luffa. The highest price of Rs. 580.00/kg was recorded for drumsticks, while the lowest price of Rs. 84.00/kg was for pumpkin. Highest price increase of 40% recorded for long beans. Due to limited supply from all producing areas price of green chilies has increased by 133%.

Compared to the same period of last year, wholesale prices of the vegetable varieties have decreased with 2%-57%. The highest price decrease of 57% being reported for tomatoes. However, carrot, leeks, beetroot, cabbage, drumstick, long bean and ash plantain prices are increased and ranged 5%-146%. Highest price increase of 146% recorded for drumsticks.

In line with increase wholesale prices, retail prices of most of the vegetable varieties have also increased. Retail prices of vegetables had increased by 1%-32%. Highest price increase was reported for carrots (32%). The highest price of Rs.890.00/kg was reported for drumsticks while the lowest price of Rs.175.00/kg was observed for pumpkin. In addition, price of green chilli has increased by 44%. Compared to the same period of last year, retail prices of beans, radish, cabbage, tomato, ladies fingers, brinjal, capsicum, pumpkin, cucumber, bitter gourd and snake gourd prices are decreased by 2%-5%.

4. Fruits

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

In June, considering the major fruit types, the wholesale prices of banana and mango have decreased while the price of pineapple has increased. Considering the prices of banana varieties, the prices of anamalu (8%), ambun (8%), kolikuttu (3%) and seeni (2%) banana have decreased further due to increased supply from major producing areas. However, the price of ambul (7%) banana has increased in June. During the month, the wholesale prices ranged between Rs.250.00-400.00/kg (kolikuttu), Rs.80.00-150.00/kg (ambul), Rs.80.00-140.00/kg (seeni), Rs.22.00-32.00/fruit (ambun) and Rs.18.00-25.00/fruit (anamalu). Considering the prices of pineapple, the prices of all the sizes have increased in the range of 11%-15%. Monthly average wholesale prices were Rs.632.00/fruit (large), Rs.527.00/fruit (medium) and Rs.400.00/fruit (small) sizes of fruits respectively. Considering the mango varieties, ample stocks were available for betti, karthakolomban and vilad mango in the market. Prices of those types have decreased further by 25%, 19% and 9% respectively due to on-going harvesting season in June.

Considering the other types of fruit varieties, the prices of most varieties have increased due to lean harvesting period. The highest price increase was recorded for wood apple (69%), followed by orange (44%), passion fruit (14%) and papaw (3%) due to low stock position. However, the prices of avocado (23%) and imported grapes (10%) have decreased due to increased supply from on-going harvesting period for avocado and availability of sufficient imported stocks for grapes.

Compared to the same period of last year, the current wholesale prices of most of the fruit varieties have increased with the highest price increase of 107% reported for *kolikuttu* banana (Table 4.1).

According to the price behaviour of the wholesale market, the retail prices of major fruit varieties except pineapple have decreased in June. Considering the price behaviour for banana varieties, the highest price decrease of 8% was reported for *ambul* and *kolikuttu* banana, followed by *seeni* banana (3%). Prices of *ambun* (9%) and *anamalu* (2%) banana have increased. During the month, the prices ranged between Rs.300.00-500.00/kg for *kolikuttu*, Rs.140.00-250.00/kg for *ambul* banana and Rs.150.00-220.00/kg for *seeni* banana in Colombo and suburb markets. Considering the price behaviour for pineapple varieties, the prices of all the sizes have increased in the range of 20%-21% due to increased wholesale prices and the prices ranged between Rs.450.00-900.00/fruit for medium size fruit in Colombo suburbs markets. Among the mango varieties, the price of *karthakolomban* has decreased by 6% due to availability of ample stocks in the market.

Considering the other types of fruits, the retail prices of orange (21%), wood apple (13%), and passion fruit (13%) have increased. However, the prices of slime apple (22%), avocado (9%) and papaw (2%) have decreased. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of all the fruit varieties have increased with the highest price increase of 1114% reported for pineapple (small size) (Table 4.2).

Exports/Imports of Fruits

According to Sri Lanka Customs, Sri Lanka had exported 1,285 mt of fresh fruits in June, 2023 to the value of Rs.175 mn. Of the exported quantity, 96% were papaw and 2% were fresh pineapple. Compared to June 2022 (1,693 mt), the exported quantity had decreased during this year (Table 4.4).

With reference to imports, Sri Lanka had imported 700 mt of fresh fruits during the month and the value was Rs.324 mn. Apple was the mostly imported fruit type with the quantity of 307 mt, followed by oranges (253 mt). Compared to the month of June, 2022 (1.29 mt), the imported quantity had increased during this year (Table 4.5).

5. Fish, Dried Fish, Eggs and Meat

Fish

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Although food inflation (Year-on-Year) had decreased to a single-digit level of 4.1% in June 2023 from 21.5% in May 2023, the prices of all fish varieties had increased at the wholesale level. This increase is attributed to a decrease in supply from the southern and western coastal belts, as the lean fishing season persists.

As mentioned earlier, due to the rise in the cost of living and loss of income, consumers have been compelled to reduce their consumption of high-value foods such as fish and meat, decreasing demand for these products. A shift in demand from high-value fish varieties to low-value ones continue to observe.

Among all the fresh fish varieties, the largest price hike was observed for thora at 21%, followed by hurulla at 20% and thalapath at 13%. Equally, prices for all the remaining fish varieties, with had increased within the range of 4% to 12%.

As mentioned earlier, the economic crisis-induced demand shift from high-value fish varieties to low-value ones have been observed. For instance, the price of hurulla and salaya which had been increasing for several consecutive months, in the last year and this year, showed a further price increase in June (by 20% and 9% respectively) due to high demand. In comparison to the same period in the previous year, wholesale prices for most fresh fish varieties had increased, ranging from 1% to 37%, with the most notable increase seen in the price of shrimp (small) as 37%.

As a result of the wholesale price changes, the retail prices for most of the fish varieties have increased in comparison to the previous month. The largest price increase was reported for both salaya, hurulla and kelawalla as 10%. Next, prices of kelawalla paraw and thalapath had increased by 9%. Meantime, prices of all the remaining fish varieties, had increased in the range of 4% - 8%. When compared to the same period of the previous year, retail prices for most of the fresh fish varieties have increased, with the most significant increase noted for shrimp (small) as 31%.

Dried Fish

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

In June 2023, prices of most dried fish varieties also experienced a slight increase in prices following the high prices of the common fresh fish varieties.

The highest price hike at the wholesale level was recorded for balaya as 40% due to high fresh fish prices. Further, prices of sprats (local) had increased by 34%. The prices of remaining dried fish varieties, except for anguluwa (imported) increased by less than 9%. However, prices of anguluwa (imported) had shown a price drop of 3%. Compared to the same period of the previous year, wholesale prices for all the dried fish varieties had dropped with the highest was reported for sprats (imported) as 41%.

During the same period, the retail prices of all the dried fish varieties had slightly increased, which could be attributed to increased oil prices and transportation cost. The highest price

increase was reported for sprats as 17%. Meantime, prices of balaya had increased by 16%. Except for maduwa and thora, the remaining dried fish varieties showed a price increase of less than 3%. Compared to the same period of the last year, retail prices of most of the dried fish varieties had dropped, with the highest price drop noted for sprats (imported) as 31%.

Eggs

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The Consumer Affairs Authority had issued a new Gazette notification on January 20th, 2023, renewing the maximum retail price (MRP) for eggs. According to the stipulated MRP, white eggs must be sold at Rs. 44, while brown eggs must be sold at Rs. 46.

In the wholesale market, prices of both brown eggs and white eggs had increased by 5% and 4% respectively due to high demand for eggs as a result of diminishing supply of fish. The recorded average wholesale price of a white egg (Rs. 51.00) and a brown egg (Rs. 50.00) was higher than the stipulated maximum retail price of Rs.46.00 and Rs 44.00 respectively.

In the retail market, prices of both brown eggs and white eggs had increased by 6% and 5% respectively. Further, the reported average price of Rs 53.00 for both brown egg and white egg was higher than the MRP. When comparing to the same period last year, the wholesale prices of both types of eggs had surged in the range of 19% - 27%.

Meat

Compared to May, prices of most of the meat varieties had slightly increased at the retail market in June. The highest price hike was noted for chicken (curry) as 7%. Next, prices of chicken (broiler) had increased by 6%. Meanwhile, the highest price drop was reported for pork as 3%. Compared to last year, prices of all the meat varieties had increased with the highest was reported for pork as 56%.

6. Wheat grain, Wheat flour and Sugar

Wheat grain and Wheat flour

A Total quantity of 118,338mt of wheat grain, worth of 11,717mn had been imported during June. Compared to the quantity imported in previous month, the quantity imported in this month has increased by around 27,991mt. Wheat grain was mainly imported from Romania (99%), Canada and Australia (1%) at a CIF price of Rs.98.57/kg, Rs.154.08/kg and Rs.143.53/kg respectively. Compared to the previous month, average CIF price has decreased by Rs.11.65/kg. The highest CIF price was for wheat grain imported from Canada whilst the lowest CIF price was for wheat grain imported from Romania.

Total Quantity of wheat flour imported in this month was 24,772mt, worth 3,192mn. Compared to the previous month, this month quantity has increased by around 13,211mt. The highest quantity of wheat flour has imported from Turkey at a CIF price of Rs.128.47/kg and that was 98% of the total quantity of wheat flour imported in June. Remain quantity has imported from India (1%), UAE (0.7%) and few quantities from China and Singapore. Average CIF price of wheat flour imported in this month was Rs.128.86/kg and compared to the previous month it has decreased by Rs.16.69/kg.

Meanwhile, the local retail price of wheat flour ranged from Rs.217.92-235.00/kg and the average price was Rs.220.70/kg. Compared to last month, the average retail price of wheat flour has decreased by 5% and compared to the same period of last year, price has decreased by 22%.

Sugar

Total quantity of sugar imported in this month was 22,358mt worth 4,894mn and it has decreased by around 2,340mt when compared to the quantity imported in May. The largest quantity of sugar was mainly imported from India and that was 89.5% of the total quantity. Rest of quantity has imported from Thailand (6%), UAE (3%) and South Korea (1.5%). The average CIF price was Rs.218.90/kg and compared to the previous month it has increased by Rs.1.59/kg. The highest CIF price was paid for sugar imported from India (Rs.220.79/kg) while the lowest was paid for sugar imported from UAE (Rs.198.88/kg).

Referring to the local retail price of sugar for the month, price ranged from Rs.232.46-243.00/kg and the average retail price was Rs.237.66/kg. Compared to the last month, average retail price has decreased by 8% and compared to the same period of last year price has decreased by 26%.
