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
RICE:

Significant price changes were not recorded for most of the rice varieties during this month. Continuous increases in wholesale prices of most of the rice varieties were recorded. Further, price increase could be expected during next month too due to the offseason.

VEGETABLES:

Supplies of both up country and low country vegetables were further limited in most of the markets because of the offseason for vegetables. The highest price increase of Rs.231.00/kg was recorded for drumsticks followed by tomato (Rs.206.00/kg). The price of vegetables will come down in December as the Maha harvest is expected to reach to the market.





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EXPLANTATORY NOTE

The Food Information Bulletin is a monthly publication containing information relating to producer, wholesale and retail prices of selected food commodities in selected markets in and around Colombo and main markets in the major producing areas. Data on extent, production and imports are also available in the bulletin.

The information is analyzed and presented as, prevailing prices, price ranges, averages and comparison of monthly prices. The changes in prices reported are always in relation to price, which prevailed during the previous month unless otherwise stated.

1. Paddy

Crop Situation

The prospects of the paddy crop in 2018/19 *Maha* season have been satisfactory in most of the major producing areas. Rainy weather was experienced in all major producing areas from the beginning of the season. Prevailing favorable weather condition and better water availability in irrigation tanks contributed to the success of the paddy crop. According to the field information on cultivation, paddy has been cultivated in almost all major producing areas. According to the latest crop forecast report of Department of Agriculture, the targeted extent of lands cultivated with paddy in 2018/19 *Maha* season was 828,455 ha. The cultivation progress by the end of November has been 79% of the target and is 653,441 ha. The cultivation progress is higher than 42% of the progress of the average extent of land cultivated with paddy in the last three *Maha* seasons. The expected production based on the reported extent of land cultivated with paddy by the end of November is 2.55 Million Mt, considering the crop damages. The first harvest can be expected from Batticaloa and Ampara districts in the late January, 2019.

Producer Prices

The farm gate prices of all the paddy varieties had shown an increasing trend during November mainly due to the limited supply of paddy to the markets. The monthly average prices of short grain white paddy had increased by less than 11%, compared to price of the previous month, in all major producing areas with the highest increase reported from Kalawewa. Prices of long grain white paddy had increased by 4% -10%, compared to price of the previous month, in most of the major producing areas with the highest increase reported from Kalawewa. Meanwhile, the prices of long grain red paddy had increased by less than 4% compared to price of the previous month, in Embilipitiya and 8% compared to price of the previous month, in Hambanthota and Mathara producing areas in Southern Province.

The prices of long grain white and short grain were in the range of Rs.40.00-47.00/kg and Rs.48.00-55.00/kg respectively in most of the major producing areas in November 2018. Prices of long grain red paddy were in the range of Rs.33.00-41.00/kg in producing areas in the Southern Province in this month. Paddy price was expected to be in the increasing trend during the next month as paddy would be in short supply. Compared to the same period of last year, prices of all paddy varieties showed a declining trend in all considered producing areas. The prices of short grain had decreased by less than 12% with the highest decline reported from Kalawewa. Prices of long grain white had decreased in the range of 18%-24% with the highest decline from reported Kurunegala. Meanwhile, the prices of long grain red had decreased in the range of 8%-24% with the highest decline reported from Embilipitiya.

Rice Demand and Supply Situation

Wholesale Prices

Supplies of most of the rice varieties had decreased during November 2018. Therefore, the wholesale prices of most of the rice varieties had increased with the highest price increase of 5% for raw white. Average prices of samba grade I and II were Rs.107.60/kg and Rs.99.58/kg respectively and significant changes in prices were not recorded during this month.

Average wholesale prices of raw red and raw white rice were Rs.70.33/kg and Rs.79.04/kg and prices had increased by Rs.1.76/kg and Rs.3.46/kg respectively.

Meanwhile, the wholesale price of imported samba rice ranged between Rs.135.00/kg and Rs. 145.00/kg and price had increased by 6% compared to the previous month. According to the Department of Custom of Sri Lanka, the imported quantity of rice had further increased up to 1,741mt in November. The total expenditure on imported rice was Rs.244.1 million in this month.

A quantity of 54mt of raw white rice had been imported from Pakistan, Vietnam and China in November. Further, quantities of *Nadu* and *Ponni* samba imported in November were 19mt and 27mt respectively. Out of these imported rice, 95% of *Nadu* was from India while 96% of *Ponni Samba* was from Vietnam.

Compared to the same period of last year, wholesale prices of all the rice varieties had decreased with the highest price decrease of 15% for raw red. Meanwhile, the wholesale price of *Ponni Samba* had increased by 90% compared to the same period of last year.

Retail Prices

Retail prices of *Samba* and *Nadu* rice varieties had decreased by the range of 1%-4% compared to the previous month. In line with the wholesale prices, retail prices of raw red and raw white rice varieties had increased by 3% and 4% respectively. Retail price of imported *Ponni Samba* ranged between Rs.140.00/kg and Rs.150.00/kg and the average price of *Ponni Samba* has increased by 6% due to increase in wholesale prices.

Compared to the same period of last year, retail prices of all the local rice varieties had decreased with the highest price decrease of 16% for *Nadu* grade II. Retail price of imported *Ponni Samba* had increased significantly by 67% compared to the same period of last year.

2. Other Field Crops

2.1 Chilli

Crop Situation

Targeted extent of land cultivated with chilli was 10,703 ha in Maha 2018/2019. The cultivated extent of land, about only 42% of the targeted extent, was 4,460 ha by the end of November 2018. The highest cultivated extent of land, 1,133 ha, was reported from Anuradhapura district followed by the cultivated extent of land, 624 ha, in Moneragala district and, 387 ha, in Puttalam. Compared to the same period of previous season, the cultivated extent of green chilli had increased by about 24% at the end of November. The total expected production of green chilli is 21,919 mt of which 65% of production was expected from Anuradhapura (26%), Moneragala (22%) and Puttalam (17%) districts.

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Supply of green chilli from main producing areas had decreased further during this month. Hence, both wholesale and retail prices of green chilli had increased by about Rs.125.00/kg and Rs.163.00/kg respectively. The average wholesale and retail prices of green chilli were Rs.220.08/kg and Rs.418.23/kg respectively and average retail price of green chilli was higher than that of the average retail price of imported dried chilli. Compared to the same period of last year, both wholesale and retail prices of green chillie had increased by about 67% and 53% respectively.

A quantity of 4020 mt of dried chilli was imported from India and it was 1014 mt lower than the quantity imported in the previous month. The average CIF price was Rs.225.29/kg that was Rs.16.21/kg higher than CIF price of last month. Both wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chilli had also increased by Rs.19.00/kg and Rs.8.00/kg respectively as imported quantities were low. Compared to the same period of last year, both wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chilli had increased by about 29% and 24% respectively.

2.2 Big Onion and Red Onion

Crop situation

Harvesting of big onion in Matale district in *Yala* season was almost finished by the end of November 2018. The extent of lands targeted for cultivating big onion was around 185 ha in *Maha* season of 2018/19 in Sri Lanka and only 10 ha was cultivated by the end of November 2018.

The targeted extent of lands for cultivating red onion in *Maha* 2018/19 was 3,906 ha in Sri Lanka and the extent of 507 ha, 13% of the target, was cultivated by the end of November 2018. Cultivation progress of red onion in Puttalam district was comparatively higher than that of the other districts and the cultivated extent of land was about 334 ha, 52% of the target, by the end of November. The targeted extent of lands for cultivating red onion in Jaffna district in this *Maha* season was 1,900 ha of which 3% or 48 ha were cultivated by the end of November. The total expected production of red onion is 8,886 mt at the end of November 2018 and 86% of that production could be expected from Puttalam (80% of production) and Jaffna (6% of production).

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Stocks of local big onion were not available at the market due to the end of the harvesting season. Quantity of big onion imported in this month was about 18,659 mt of which 15,277 mt (82%) was from India and 3,382 mt (18%) from Pakistan. Total imported quantity was 4,067 mt higher than that of the previous month. The average CIF price was Rs. 47.64/kg and it was Rs.1.70/kg higher than CIF price of last month. However, both wholesale and retail prices of imported big onion had increased by about Rs.6.00/kg and Rs.9.00/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of last year, both wholesale and retail prices of imported big onion had decreased by about 28%.

Supply of local red onion from main producing areas had decreased further as it was the end of the harvesting season. Hence, wholesale prices of both sinnan and vedalan had increased by about Rs.30.00/kg. Retail prices of sinnan and vedalan had increased by about Rs.46.00/kg and Rs.1.00/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of last year, retail price of vedalan had decreased by about 66%.

Quantity of red onion imported in this month was about 1,334 mt from India. Total imported quantity was 1069 mt higher than that of the previous month. Average CIF price was Rs.113.46/kg and it had not changed significantly compared to last month. Wholesale price of imported red onion had decreased by about Rs.21.00/kg and prices ranged between Rs.200.00-280.00/kg at the retail markets.

2.3 Potato

Crop Situation and Progress

The targeted extent of land for cultivating potato in *Maha* season, 2018/19 was 2,964 ha which was lower than the targeted extent of land for cultivating potato in *Maha* season 2017/18. The extent of land cultivated with potato by the end of November 2019 was about 511 ha ad was 17% achievement of the target. The cultivated extent of land by the end of November, 2019 was lower than that of the same period of last *Maha* season due to the prevailed bad weather condition. According to the cultivated extent of land by the end of this month, the expected production of potato was 8,907 mt.

In the Nuwara Eliya district, the targeted extent was 1,323 ha of which about 221 ha of potato was cultivated by the end of this month (17% progress). The cultivated extent of land in this *Maha* season was lower than that of the same period of last *Maha* season as bad weather condition prevented farmers from new cultivation. The targeted extent of land in this *Maha* season was 1,502 ha in Badulla district and 286 ha (19% of the target) was cultivated by the end of November. The cultivated extent of land in Badulla district in this season was lower than that of the same period of last *Maha* season. As the *Yala* harvesting of potato was finished in November, the supply of Welimada potato was lower in November.

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

A quantity of 10,681 mt of potato had been imported in November which was 4,352 mt higher than that was imported during the previous month. Imported stocks were mainly from Pakistan (78%) and India (15%). Quantity of potato imported in this month was lower than that of November, 2017. The quantity of potato imported in November, 2017 was 13,330 mt. Average CIF price was Rs.41.00/kg in November.

With regard to local potato, the supply had dropped due to the end of the peak harvesting season in major producing areas. Stocks of Welimada potato were not available in the market. Therefore, the wholesale and retail prices of Nuwara Eliya potatoes had increased by 30% and 19% respectively. On average, the producer price of Nuwara Eliya potato was Rs.125.00/kg in November. Wholesale and retail prices of imported potato had increased by 18% and 12% respectively due to low availability of potato stocks. During the month of November, the wholesale prices of Nuwara Eliya and imported potatoes ranged between Rs.110.00-170.00/kg and Rs.75.00-130.00/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of Nuwara Eliya (16%) and imported (13%) potatoes had increased. Prices of potatoes were expected to be increased further in December due to end of major harvesting period.

2.4 Green gram and Cowpea

Crop Situation and Progress

Green gram cultivation extent had been achieved around 35% of its targeted extent in *Maha* season, 2018/2019. According to the table 2.4.1, the extent of land cultivated with green gram had declined by 3175 ha (52% compared to *Maha* season 2017/2018) in Sri Lanka compared with last year. Extents of lands cultivated with green gram were less more than 46% in Hambantota, 14% in Monaragala and 4% in Kurunegala compared to the previous year. Considering the crop damages, the expected production from the island-wide green gram cultivation in this year was 3,942 mt which was half of the production of the previous year.

It was able to achieve 26% of the targeted extent of land cultivated with cowpea and the expected production was around 3,133 mt. Ampara, Monaragala and Anuradhapura are major cowpeaproducing districts in 2018/19 *Maha* season and are expected to contribute to 46% of the total cowpea production in the country. Compared to the cowpea cultivation extent of land in the previous *Maha* season, the extent of land in this season had decreased by 25%. However, Monaragala district was highlighted a better progress than other districts. The cultivation progress of green gram and cowpea were one fourth and one third of their targets respectively.

Prices and Supply Demand Situation

The wholesale price of green gram ranged between Rs.190.00/kg and Rs.230.00/kg with an average of Rs.209.75/kg in November 2018. The average price had increased by 4% compared to the previous month. Similarly, compared to the same period of last year, the wholesale price had increased by 5%. In the meantime, the retail price of green gram ranged between Rs.215.00/kg and Rs.320.00/kg with an average of Rs.249.66/kg. Compared to the previous month, the retail price had increased by Rs. 5/kg. However, compared to the same period of last year, the retail price for this month had increased by 3%.

Average wholesale prices of white and red cowpea were recorded as Rs.214.98/kg and Rs.203.64/kg respectively in November 2018. The wholesale price of white cowpea ranged between Rs.210/kg and Rs.230/kg, and that of red cowpea ranged between Rs.155/kg and Rs.220/kg. Compared to the previous month, the wholesale price of white cowpea had increased by 3% while the price of red cowpea had increased by 11%. Compared to the same period of last year, wholesale prices of white and red cowpea had decreased by 4% and 12% respectively. Meanwhile, average retail prices of white and red cowpea were recorded as Rs.279.38/kg and Rs.284.52/kg respectively. The retail price of white cowpea ranged between Rs.240/kg and Rs.320/kg, and that of red cowpea also ranged between Rs.240/kg and Rs.320/kg. Compared to the same period of last increased by 6%. Compared to the same period of last year, retail prices of white and red cowpea had increased by 1.5% and the price of red cowpea had increased by 6% and 10%, respectively.

Quantity of 808 mt of green gram had been imported in this month and was 23% lower than that of the green gram imported in the previous month. The average CIF price of a kilogram of a green gram was Rs.148.80/kg while the retail price had increased by 5% compared to the previous month. The total expenditure of the importation of green gram was recorded as Rs.120.29 million which had reduced by 18% of the total value spent on green gram importation in the previous month. Green gram had been imported from several counties which were South Africa (28%), Uzbekistan (28%), Argentina (24%), Australia (9%), Kenya (6%) and Myanmar (5%).

According to the table 2.4.4, quantity of 740 mt of white cowpea had been imported in this month. The imported quantity of the cowpea had decreased by 32% compared to the previous month. The average CIF price of kilograms of white cowpea was recorded as Rs.112.56/kg. The total expenditure on cowpea imported had decreased by 32% compared to the previous month expenditure. The total value of the cowpea imported was noted as approximately Rs.83 million. The highest quantity of cowpea was imported from Madagascar (57%) and the rest was imported from India (20%), Myanmar (13%) and Brazil (10%).

2.5 Red dhal

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The wholesale price of red dhal ranged between Rs.100.00/kg and Rs.110.00/kg with an average of Rs.103.16/kg, and the retail price ranged between Rs.110.00/kg and Rs.140.00/kg with an average of Rs.124.13/kg. Moreover, a difference between the two prices is Rs.21/kg during this month. Compared to the same period of last year, wholesale and retail prices had decreased by 13% and 18%, respectively.

During this month, quantity of 14,866 mt of red dhal had been imported at an average CIF price of Rs.76.60/kg and CIF price had not changed significantly. Of the total red dhal quantity, the largest quantity (i.e., 14,731 mt) was of the whole type while the rest (i.e., 135 MT) was of the split type. Of the whole type red dhal, 56% from Australia and 44% from Canada had been imported. The total value of the whole type red dhal imports was Rs. 1,126 million, with an average CIF price of Rs.76.44 per kilo and the split type red dhal, had been imported from India (42%), Australia (40%) and United Arab Emirate (19%). The average CIF price of split type was noted as Rs.93.87 per kilo and the total value of the imported split type was Rs.12.7 million.

3. Vegetables

Crop Situation

Rainy weather condition further prevailed in Badulla and Kandy districts during November 2019. The cultivation in 2018/19 *Maha* season was in progress as usual in major upcountry vegetable producing areas that are Nuwara Eliya, Badulla, and Ratnapura districts. By the end of November, the mostly cultivated vegetables in Nuwara Eliya district were carrot, beetroot, leeks and beans. In Badulla district, 16%-30% of the target had been achieved and the mostly cultivated vegetables were cabbage, carrot, and tomato. The cultivation progress of Kandy district was recorded as 39% of the target and beans and tomato were mostly cultivated vegetables. The harvest of 2018/19 *Maha* season is expected to reach to the market from December 2018 and January 2019.

Concerning the crop situation of low county vegetables, a rainy weather condition continued in major producing areas. Nevertheless, the cultivation in 2018/19 *Maha* season was in progress as usual in most of the producing areas except Dambulla. As at the end of November, 45% of the target had been achieved in Anuradhapura district, and pumpkin and green chilli were the mostly cultivate vegetables. According to the HARTI field information, pumpkin was the mostly cultivated vegetable in Monaragala district too. With regard to the cultivation progress in Kurunegala district, about 31% of the target was achieved by the end of November. Meanwhile, the cultivation progress in Dambulla was delayed because of unfavorable rainy weather condition. The unfavorable rainy weather condition caused delay land preparation and crop establishment in Dambulla. The decrease of vegetable cultivation was about 40% compared to the previous *Maha* season. Tomato and beans were the mostly cultivated vegetables in Dambulla.

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Supplies of both upcountry and low country vegetables to most of the major markets were further limited because of the offseason for vegetables. Supply to the Dambulla Dedicated Economic Center and Nuwara Eliya markets decreased by 50% and 40%-60% respectively. Hence, the wholesale prices of both upcountry and low country vegetables remarkably increased in November. With regards to upcountry vegetables, the highest price increase of 205% was recorded for leeks, followed by tomato (177%) and knolkhol (124%). Further, the price of beans increased by 34% while price of other upcountry vegetables increased by a range of 50%-95%. The wholesale prices of low county vegetables also increased during this month and the highest price increase of 104% was recorded for capsicum. Meanwhile, the price of ladies-fingers and drumsticks had increased by 57% and 69% respectively. Further, the prices of brinjal, pumpkin bitter guard and long beans increased by percentages between 18%-40% while that of cucumber, snake guard, luffa and ash plantain increased by less than 10%. Prices will come down in December as the *Maha* harvest was expected to reach to the market. Compared to the same period of last year, the prices of most of vegetables had increased during this month and the highest price was reported (216%) for tomato.

A notable price increase in retail prices observed for both upcountry and low country vegetables. With regard to upcountry vegetable, the highest price increase of Rs.206.00/kg was recorded for tomato, followed by carrot (Rs.122.000/kg). With reference to low country vegetables, the highest price increase of Rs.231.00/kg was recorded for drumsticks, followed by capsicum (Rs.151.00/kg). The price behavior of vegetables in November was matched with usual price pattern. According to the seasonal price index, higher prices prevailed in November. Compared to the same period of last year, prices of most of vegetables had increased and the highest price increase of 119% was for tomato.

4. Fruits

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Compared to the prices in October, wholesale prices of banana and mango varieties and pineapple had decreased in November. Prices of banana varieties had decreased in the range of 4%-19% and prices of Ambul, Kolikuttu and Seeni had decreased by 19%, 16% and 4% respectively and price ranges recorded during this month were Rs.40.00-60.00/kg, Rs.100.00-140.00/kg and Rs.50.00-70.00/kg respectively. In addition, price decreases of 14% and 11% were noted for banana varieties, Ambun and Anmalu and price ranges recorded were Rs.15.00-18.00/fruit and Rs.10.00-15.00/fruit respectively. Prices of small, medium and large sized pineapple had decreased in the range of 44%-46% and the monthly average wholesale prices of small, medium and large sized fruits were Rs.76.88/fruit, Rs.110.31/fruit and Rs.143.25/fruit respectively and the price ranged between Rs.60.00-180.00/fruit. Further, prices of mango varieties, Betti, Karthakolomban and Vilad had decreased by 45%, 36% and 12% respectively. Price range recorded for a Karthakolomban fruit was Rs.35.00-60.00.

However, price of papaw had increased by 3% and the monthly average wholesale price was Rs.72.50/kg and the price ranged between Rs.40.00-120.00/kg. In addition, 39% and 32% price increases were noted for orange and passion fruit respectively. Further, prices of avocado, wood apple and slime apple had increased by 28%, 14% and 10% respectively. Prices of imported grapes had not changed significantly.

According to the data in previous years, prices of fruit varieties, papaw, passion fruit, wood apple, avocado, orange and all the banana varieties except Kolikuttu are expected to be increased in the coming month while, prices of pineapple, mango and slime apple are expected to be decreased.

Compared to the same period of 2017, wholesale prices of most of the banana varieties, wood apple, orange, slime apple and imported grapes had decreased with the highest price decrease of 31% for banana variety, Ambul. Prices of pineapple, most of the mango varieties, papaw, passion fruit and avocado had increased with the highest price increase of 109% for passion fruit.

In line with the decreased wholesale prices, prices of banana and mango varieties and pineapple had decreased at the retail level too. Prices of banana varieties had decreased in the range of 1%-9% and prices of Ambul and Kolikuttu had decreased by 9%. A price decrease of 6% was noted for banana variety, Seeni. Price ranges of Ambul, Kolikuttu and Seeni were noted as Rs.60.00-120.00/kg, Rs.160.00-220.00/kg and Rs.80.00-130.00/kg respectively. Further, price of banana varieties, Anamalu and Ambun had decreased by 1% and price ranges recorded during the month were Rs.15.00-20.00/fruit and Rs.18.00-25.00/fruit respectively. Prices of small, medium and large sized pineapple had decreased by 34%, 32% and 30% respectively. Further, price range recorded for pineapple was Rs.80.00-350.00/fruit. In addition, price of mango varieties, Karthakolomban and Vilad had decreased by 43% and 27% respectively and price of a Karthakolomban fruit was noted as Rs.50.00-150.00.

However, prices of avocado, passion fruit and orange had increased by 34%, 24% and 23% respectively. In addition, prices of slime apple, wood apple and imported grapes had increased by 11%, 10% and 3% respectively. Price of papaw had not changed significantly compared to the previous month and the price ranged between Rs.70.00-180.00/kg. Compared to the same period of 2017, retail prices of most of the fruit varieties had increased and the highest price increase was noted for passion fruit as 89%.

With reference to the producer prices, producers had received increased prices for banana varieties, Ambul and Kolikuttu and for papaw compared to the prices in October, 2018. The prices had increased by 10% for papaw and by 5% for both Ambul and Kolikuttu. Further, producer prices for Ambul, Kolikuttu and papaw ranged between Rs.27.50-47.86/kg, Rs.100.00-170.00/kg and Rs.27.50 - 80.00/kg respectively. At the same time, compared to November, 2017, producer prices had increased for papaw significantly by 65% and for Kolikuttu by 26% and it was a price decrease for Ambul by 15% (Table 4.3).

Exports/Imports of Fruits

According to the Sri Lanka Customs, Sri Lanka had exported 895 mt of fresh fruits, worth Rs. 97 mn, in November, 2018. Of the exported quantity, 91% was papaw, 4% was fresh pineapple and another 4% was fresh mangoes. Further, two metric tons of fresh avocados also had been exported. However, it was less than 1% of the total quantity exported in this month. In October, 2018, the quantity exported was 802 mt. Therefore, compared to last month, the exported quantity had increased by 12%.

If fruit imports in November 2018 are considered, Sri Lanka had imported 4,001 mt of fresh fruits, worth Rs. 714 mn, during this month. Of the imported quantity, 72% were apple, 15% were oranges and 13% were grapes. The main importing countries of apple were China, the United States, Italy, France and South Africa. South Africa and Australia were the importing countries of oranges. Grapes had been imported from the United States, China, Italy and India. In October, 2018, the quantity imported was 5,235mt. Therefore, compared to last month, the imported quantity had decreased by 24%.

5. Fish, Dried Fish, Eggs and Meat

Fish

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Average wholesale prices of selected fresh fish ranged between Rs.118.00/kg and Rs.1154.00/kg during November. Weekly market observations indicated that the supply of fresh fish had decreased during this month and the market prices increased. Therefore, when we compared the prices with last month wholesale market prices all the fresh fish prices had been increased except for small Shrimps. The highest price increase was observed in Balaya as 40% and the lowest price increase was observed in Thalapath as 4%. The only price decrease was observed as 1.23% for small Shrimps.

At the same time, average retail prices of selected fresh fish types ranged between Rs.201.00/kg and Rs.1507.00/kg during this month. Consumers had to pay between Rs.120.00 and Rs.2200.00 to purchase a kilo of any types of fresh fish. Retail prices of most fresh fish types showed increase (except for small shrimps and Thora) compared to last month fish prices. Therefore, the highest price increase was observed in Balaya (25%) and the lowest increase was observed in Thalapata (3%). However, prices for Thora and small shrimps declined by 0.52% and 0.29% respectively.

Dried Fish

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Average wholesale prices of selected dried fish types ranged between Rs.201.00 /kg and Rs.1188.00 /kg during November. Compared to the previous month, prices of most dried fish types had fluctuated. The highest price increase was observed in local Balaya as 62%, and the lowest price increase was observed in imported Mora as 1%. At the same time prices of Sprats, local and imported Kattawa, local Mora, imported Balaya, imported Anguluwa, and imported Maduwa were increased. In the meantime, significant price declines were reported with regard to local Thora by 106%, local Anguluwa by 31%, local Salaya by 17%, imported Sprats by 11%, local Maduwa by 7% and imported Thora by 6%.

At the same time, average retail prices of selected dried fish types ranged between 697.00/kg and Rs.1620.00 /kg during this month. However, compared to the previous month, retail prices of most dried fish types had increased slightly by 2% to 41%, except imported Sprats, local Thora, local Maduwa, and local Salaya. The highest price increase was observed with regard to local Balaya as 41%, and the lowest price increase was observed with regard to local Kattawa as 2%. The highest retail price decrease of local Maduwa was reported as 81 % and the lowest price decrease of selected as 9%.

Eggs

Wholesale prices of brown and white eggs had increased by 19% to 20%, respectively. Upcoming festive season can be one of the reasons for this price increase. Price of a brown egg ranged between Rs. 13.50 and Rs. 17.50, whilst that of a white egg ranged between Rs. 12.50 and Rs. 16.50. Compared to the same period of last year, prices of brown and white eggs had increased by 11% and 18% respectively.

At the same time, retail prices of both egg types had decreased in this month. The average prices of brown and white eggs were reported as Rs. 17.29 and Rs.16.25 respectively. Compared to previous month, prices of brown and white eggs had increased by 15% and 16%, respectively. Moreover, compared to the previous year, prices of both eggs had increased by 14% and 17%, respectively.

Prices of most meat types had changed significantly during November. The highest meat price observed of mutton and it was Rs.1847.00, and the lowest price observed of pork (it was Rs.711.00). Furthermore, compared to the previous month, prices of curry chicken and pork had increased by 8% and 2 % respectively. However, compared to the previous year prices of all types of meat had increased significantly. The highest price increased was observed of pork as 38%.

6. Wheat grain, Wheat flour and Sugar

Wheat grain, Wheat flour

Total quantity of wheat grain imported during November, 2018 was 94,907 mt and was worth Rs. 4,414 mn. The quantity of wheat grain imported in this month had drastically decreased and it was about a half of the quantity imported in the previous month. Wheat grain for November, 2018 had been mainly imported from Canada (34%) and the CIF price was Rs.48.00/kg. Second and third highest wheat grain quantities were imported from Russia (29,222 mt) and Pakistan (16,000 mt) respectively. In addition, wheat grain had been imported from United States (15%) and Australia (4%). Few quantities were also imported from India. The CIF price of wheat grain ranged between Rs.42.00-66.00/kg and the average CIF price was recorded as Rs.47.00/kg. Compared to the previous month, average CIF price for wheat grain had increased by Rs.2.00/kg. The highest CIF price was reported for the Indian wheat grain stock whilst the lowest recorded for Pakistan stocks.

Total quantity of wheat flour imported during November, 2018 was 537 mt and was worth 38 mn. Quantity imported in this month was nearly a half of the quantity imported in the previous month. The highest quantity of wheat flour for November had been imported from India (77%) and the CIF price was Rs.74.00/kg. Further, wheat flour had been imported from Pakistan (15%) as well. In addition, few quantities were also imported from Hong Kong, China and Italy. The CIF price for wheat flour for the month of November ranged between Rs.38.00-189.00/kg and the average CIF was Rs.71.00/kg. Compared to the previous month, average CIF price for wheat flour had increased by Rs.2.00/kg. The highest CIF price was for the Italian wheat flour stock whilst the lowest was for the Hong Kong stocks.

Meanwhile, the local retail price of wheat flour ranged between Rs.87.00-100.00/kg and the average price was Rs.94.00/kg. The average retail price of wheat flour had decreased by Rs.2.00/kg during this month. Further, compared to the same period of last year, retail price of wheat flour had increased by 4%.

Sugar

Total quantity of sugar imported in this month was 35,396 mt and was worth Rs. 2,095 mn. Compared to the previous month, quantity of this month had increased by 9%. Sugar for this month had been mainly imported from India (92%) and CIF price was Rs.58.00/kg. The second highest quantity of sugar was imported from Thailand (7%). Furthermore, sugar had been also imported from United Arab Emirates (1%). In addition, few quantities were also imported from Korea and Malaysia. The CIF prices ranged between Rs.58.00-108.00/kg and the average CIF price was reported as Rs.59.00/kg. The average CIF price had increased only by Rs.1.00/kg during this month. The highest CIF price was applied to the imports from Malaysia while the lowest for the Indian stocks.

Referring to the local retail price of sugar for November, 2018, price ranged between Rs.100.00-120.00/kg and the average retail price was Rs.108.00/kg. Average retail price for sugar had decreased by Rs.3.00/kg. Further, compared to the same period of last year average retail price of sugar has decreased by 3%.
