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
RICE:

Due to receiving less paddy stocks to the market and availability of well dried paddy stocks in the market with the end of 2016 *yala* season the paddy prices have increased. In line with the increased paddy prices of all the local rice varieties have also increased. Accordingly, the highest price increase was reported for raw white as 12%.



Supplies of most of the upcountry and low-country varieties of vegetables further dropped due to low cultivation during the intermediate season and thereby prices increased in most of the types. Reported average price increases were 20% and 42% respectively for upcountry and lowcountry varieties.





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EXPLANTATORY NOTE

The Food Information Bulletin is a monthly publication containing information relating to producer, wholesale and retail prices of selected food commodities in selected markets in and around Colombo and main markets in the major producing areas. Data on extent, production and imports are also available in the bulletin.

The information is analyzed and presented as, prevailing prices, price ranges, averages and comparison of monthly prices. The changes in prices reported are always in relation to price, which prevailed during the previous month unless otherwise stated.

1. Paddy

Crop Situation

Early prospects of paddy cultivation for the 2016/17 *Maha* season were not satisfactory in most of the paddy producing areas during the month due to the delay of North West monsoons. Land preparation activities for paddy cultivation did not commence in most of the producing areas. Water issues have emerged in some of the major irrigation schemes and it is expected that those issues would appear early next month in other major irrigation schemes. However, land preparation activities were somewhat in progress in Ampara a major producing district. In all other major producing areas land preparation activities have not commenced due to the delayed rains. In a normal *Maha* season the cultivated extent of paddy is more than 0.7 million hectares.

Producer Prices

The increasing trend of paddy prices was continuing throughout the month in most of the major producing areas mainly due to the limited supply of paddy to the markets. Increase of the arrival of well-dried paddy to the markets also caused the price increase. The price increase was also induced by the delaying of the cultivation as a result of onset of monsoons for the 2016/17 *Maha* season in all major producing areas. Prices of short grain ranged between Rs.36.00-45.00/kg in major producing areas and the highest prices were recorded in Anuradhapura. Prices of long grain white ranged between Rs.34.00-42.00/kg in major producing areas and the highest prices were recorded in Anuradhapura and Embilipitiya. The prices of long grain red paddy ranged between Rs.34.00-42.00/kg. Prices of *keeri* samba paddy ranged between Rs.44.00-54.00/kg in Polonnaruwa and Dehiattakandiya producing areas. According to the field information the increasing trend of paddy prices is expected to continue during next month.

Compared to the same period of last year, prices of long grain white paddy have increased by 18%-31% and prices of long grain red paddy have increased by 19%-25% in all the major producing areas. However, the prices of short grain white paddy have decreased by less than 5% in Anuradhapura, Kurunegala and Nikaweratiya while the prices have increased by less than 8% in Polonnaruwa, Ampara and Dehiattakandiya producing areas.

Rice Demand and Supply Situation

Wholesale Prices

Paddy cultivation in 2016/17 *maha* season has started in several major producing areas and not started in some of the producing areas. An increase of paddy prices was observed during the whole month compared to last month. Due to receiving less paddy stocks to the market and availability of well dried paddy stocks in the market with the ending of 2016 *yala* season, the paddy prices have increased. In line with the increased paddy prices, the prices of all the local rice varieties have also increased. Accordingly, the highest price increase was reported for raw white as 12%. Furthermore, the prices have increased by 10% for samba grade II and nadu varieties, by 9% for raw red and by 5% for samba grade I. According to the statistical data released by the Department of Customs, rice imports of this month have slightly increased and the imported amount was 3,484 mt. The price of imported *ponni* samba has increased by 6% due to the availability of low stocks in the market.

Compared to the same period of last year, the wholesale prices of local samba varieties have decreased in the range of 4%-5%, while the prices of all the other local rice varieties have increased in the range of 10%-13%.

Retail Prices

In line with the increased wholesale prices, the retail prices of all the rice varieties have also increased. Accordingly, the prices have increased by Rs.5.00/kg for raw red, by Rs.4.00/kg for

raw white, by Rs.3.00/kg for nadu grade II and by less than Rs.2.00/kg for all the other local rice varieties. Furthermore, the price of imported *ponni* samba has also increased by Rs.5.00/kg. The highest local rice price of Rs.100.00/kg was reported for samba grade I and the lowest price of Rs.60.00/kg was reported for raw white.

Referring to retail prices of outstation markets except Colombo, the highest samba price range of Rs.88.00-106.00/kg was reported in Kegalle and Embilipitiya markets while the lowest samba price range of Rs.77.00-85.00/kg was reported in Jaffna, Kilinochchi and Puttalam markets. The highest nadu price range of Rs.81.00-89.00/kg was noted in Jaffna market and the lowest nadu price range of Rs.66.00-71.00/kg was noted in Puttalam and Trincomalee markets. Furthermore, the highest price of raw red was reported as Rs.80.00/kg in Mannar market, while the lowest price was reported as Rs.62.00/kg in Ampara market. Likewise, the highest price of raw white was observed as Rs.77.00/kg in Kegalle market and the lowest price was observed as Rs.64.00/kg in Trincomalee market.

Compared to the same period of last year, the retail prices of local samba varieties have decreased in the range of 3%-7%, while the prices of all the other local rice varieties have increased in the range of 4%-8%.

2. Other Field Crops

2.1 Chillies

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Supply of green chillies from Anuradhapura, Moneragala, Puttalam and other producing areas had decreased as it was the tail end of the harvesting season. Hence, both wholesale and retail prices of green chillies had increased by about Rs.1.00/kg and Rs.11.00/kg respectively. Average wholesale and retail prices of green chillies were Rs.51.83/kg and Rs.173.09/kg respectively and both prices had decreased by about 72% and 45% compared to the same period of last year.

Imported quantity of dried chillies was 4,250 mt and out of that 92% was imported from India, while the 8% was imported from Pakistan. It was a decrease of 295 mt compared to that of the last month. The average CIF price was Rs.261.80/kg and it was a decrease of Rs.3.35/kg. However, with availability of sufficient stocks at the market, both wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chillies had decreased by about Rs.10.00/kg and Rs.3.00/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of last year, wholesale prices of imported dried chillies had decreased by about 1%, while the retail price had increased by about 8%.

2.2 Big Onion and Red Onion

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The market supply of big onion consisted of both imported and local big onion varieties during this month also. A quantity of 4,193 mt of big onion was imported in October 2016 from India and Pakistan. This was about 4,696 mt less compared to previous month. Average CIF price was Rs.35.88/kg for imported big onion and it was an increase of Rs.7.19/kg compared to the previous month. Wholesale price of imported big onion had increased by about Rs.4.00/kg while the retail price had decreased by Rs.7.00/kg due to availability of sufficient stocks of both local and imported big onion stocks at the market.

Around 16,200 mt of big onion had been supplied to the market from Matale district during this month and this represents about 57% of the total expected production of the district. Though a continued supply of local big onion from Matale district has been recorded during this month also, the quality of big onion was good. Hence, wholesale price of local big onion had increased by about Rs.2.00/kg, while the retail price had decreased by about Rs.2.00/kg.

Compared to the same period of last year, retail prices of both imported big onion and local big onion have decreased by about 28% and 26% respectively.

About 458 mt of red onion was imported from India during this month and it was an increase of 15 mt compared to that of the previous month. Average CIF price of imported red onion was Rs.57.19/kg and it was an increase of Rs.1.26/kg compared to last month. However, both wholesale and retail prices of imported red onion had decreased by about Rs.5.00 and Rs.2.00/kg respectively due to its low quality.

The supply of both sinnan and vedalan varieties had decreased from main producing areas as it was the tail end of the harvesting season. However, wholesale price of vedalan had decreased by about Rs.3.00/kg due to availability of sufficient stocks at the market, while the retail price had increased by about Rs.2.00/kg. Wholesale price of sinnan had increased by Rs.4.00/kg, while stocks were not available at the retail markets. Compared to the same period of last year, retail prices of both vedalan and imported red onion had decreased by about 1% and 4% respectively.

2.3 Potato

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

A quantity of 7,631 mt of potato had been imported in October which was 3,223 mt higher than that was imported during the previous month as the Special Commodity Levy for imported potato has been increased to Rs.40.00/kg with effect from 25/08/2016. Imported stocks were received mainly from Pakistan and China. About 51% and 47% of the imported stocks were received from China and Pakistan respectively during this month. Compared to October, 2015 (3,575 mt), the imports were high during this month. Average CIF price was Rs.33.00/kg in October.

With regard to local potato, the supply has dropped from Welimada due to end of the peak harvesting season and sufficient stocks of the *yala* harvest of Nuwara Eliya potato were available in the market. During this month, the wholesale price of Welimada potato has not changed significantly, while the price of Nuwara Eliya potato has decreased by 1%. Also, the retail prices of Welimada and Nuwara Eliya potatoes have decreased by 3% for each. On average, the producer price of Nuwara Eliya potato was Rs.91.00/kg in October. The wholesale price of imported potato has decreased by 2% while the retail price has not changed significantly. During the month of October, the wholesale prices of Nuwara Eliya, Welimada and imported potatoes

ranged between Rs.90.00-120.00/kg, Rs.80.00-105.00/kg and Rs.78.00-100.00/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of Welimada (25%), Nuwara Eliya (7%) and imported (9%) potatoes have increased.

2.4 Green gram and Cowpea

Prices and Supply Demand Situation

A quantity of 745 mt of green gram was imported in October and it was a 811 mt decrease compared to that of September. The average CIF price was Rs.144.00/kg during this month. About 90% of the imports were received from Australia. Compared to October, 2015 (802 mt), the imported quantity of green gram was lower during this month. The wholesale and retail prices of green gram have increased by 1%. In October, the wholesale price of green gram ranged between Rs.160.00-175.00/kg. With the arrival of harvest of mid-season cultivation of green

gram, the local stocks fetched low price. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail price of green gram had decreased by 10%.

A quantity of 491 mt of cowpea was imported in October, which was 491 mt higher than the quantity imported in the previous month. About 71% and 24% of the imports were received from Madagascar and Myanmar respectively. The average CIF price was Rs.113.00/kg in October. Compared to October, 2015 (1,140 mt), the imported quantity of cowpea was lower during this month. With regard to cowpea, the wholesale prices of white and red cowpea have decreased by 1% for each. The retail prices have not changed significantly. During the month of October, the wholesale prices of white and red cowpea ranged between Rs.190.00-215.00/kg and Rs.190.00-230.00/kg respectively. Imported stocks fetched high price. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of white and red cowpea had decreased by 6% and 8% respectively.

2.5 Red dhal

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

A quantity of 9,475 mt (6,590 mt of whole type and 2,885 mt of split type) of red dhal was imported in October and it was 387 mt lower than the quantity imported in September. About 79% and 19% of the stocks of whole type had been received from Canada and United States, while 75% and 16% of split type had been received from Canada and Australia. Compared to October, 2015 (7,822 mt), the imports of red dhal were high during this month. The average CIF price was Rs.127.00/kg in October.

Wholesale and retail prices of red dhal have not changed significantly. The average wholesale price was Rs.162.00/kg in October. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail price of red dhal had decreased by 10%.

3. Vegetables

Prices and supply/Demand situation

As a result of the dry weather, cultivation extent in the intermediate season decreased considerably and thereby, the supply has decreased and the prices of most of the vegetables have increased during this month.

Considering the wholesale prices of upcountry vegetables, the prices of most of the vegetables have increased compared to last month. The highest price increase was reported for beans as 32%. Furthermore, the prices of knolkhol, radish, leeks, carrot and beetroot have increased by 30%, 27%, 15%, 11% and 8% respectively. However, the price of cabbage has decreased by 18% compared to last month.

Further, due to decreased supply from major producing areas, the prices of tomato and capsicum have increased by 1% and 46% respectively. The wholesale prices of most of the lowcountry varieties have also increased and the highest price increase was reported for bittergourd as 98%. The prices of all the other lowcountry varieties, except pumpkin, drumstick and ash plantain have increased in the range of 6%-84%. However, the prices of pumpkin, ash plantain and drumstick have decreased by 5%, 10% and 29% respectively.

In addition, prices of lime and green chillies have increased by 106% and 2% respectively compared to last month due to low supply.

4. Fruits

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

As predicted in the last month, wholesale prices of most of the fruit varieties have decreased. In order, the highest price decrease was reported for mango (karthakolomban) as 64% due to decreased demand because of low quality stocks received from Anuradhapura and Polonnaruwa areas, while price of mango (vilad) has decreased by 50%. Price of papaw also decreased by 48% due to high supplies received from Anuradhapura, Vavuniya and Embilipitiya areas. Further, prices of banana (kolikuttu, anamalu, ambun), passionfruit, slimeapple and grapes have decreased in the range of 4%-14%. In addition, of price increased fruit varieties, a 54% price increase was reported for avocado with declined supply due to the dry weather condition. Also, price of orange has increased by 22% due to limited supply and prices of banana (seeni), pineapple and woodapple have increased in the range of 1%-12%.

According to market information, prices of most of the fruit varieties can be expected to decrease in the coming month with increased supply.

Compared to the same period of last year, prices of all the fruit varieties except mango have increased and the highest price increase was reported for pineapple (small size) as 137%.

Considering about retail market price fluctuations, prices of most of the fruit varieties have increased. The highest price increase was reported for orange as 30% and price of avocado has increased by 24%. Further, prices of all the sizes of pineapple have increased in the range of 6%-15%.

Of price decreased fruit varieties, price of mango (karthakolomban) has decreased by 56% and price of mango (vilad) has decreased by 43% due to low quality stocks reaching the market. Further, price of papaw has also decreased by 36%. In addition, prices of banana (ambul, kolikuttu), woodapple and grapes (imported) have decreased in the range of 3%-5%. According to market information, prices of most of the fruits varieties have decreased in the coming month due to increased supply.

Compared to the same period of last month, prices of most of the fruit varieties have increased and the highest price increase was reported for pineapple (small size) as 126%.

According to (Table 4.3) producer prices for all the selected fruit varieties have decreased except pineapple. In order, price of papaw has decreased by 58% and prices of banana (ambul and kolikuttu) have decreased by 15% and 11% respectively. However, price of pineapple has increased by 37%. Further, producer prices for most of fruit varieties can be expected to decrease in the coming month due to increased supply.

Compared to the same period of last month, producer prices of all the selected fruit varieties have increased and the highest price increase was reported as 141% for pineapple.

Exports/Imports of Fruits

According to table 4.4 Rs.68.78mn worth of fruits (499.99) mt have been exported. Rs.40.50mn has been earned from papaw and Rs.25.55mn has been earned from pineapple. Compared to last month, the export value has increased by Rs.5.09mn and the exported fruit quantity has decreased by 68.1 mt compared to last month.

According to table 4.5, Rs.704.91mn worth of fruits has been imported and 59% of them has been expended for apple. In order, 3433 mt of apple have been imported and 81% of them have been imported from China. Further, Rs.181mn worth of grapes (572 mt) has been imported and 39% of them has been imported from Italy. As well as, compared to last month, fruit import expenditure has increased by Rs.146.88mn.

Considering export and import values for selected fruit varieties, there is a continuous existing negative trade balance and this value for month of October is Rs.636.13mn. Hence, this situation can be expected to continue further.

5. Fish, Dried Fish, Eggs and Meat

Fish

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

As predicted in the previous month, wholesale prices of all the fresh fish varieties except kelawalla, thora and thalapath had further decreased. Fishing season in the Eastern coastal belt had resulted in sufficient stocks reaching the market. Further, decreasing trend in prices for most of the fresh fish varieties were observed throughout the month except in the second week. The highest price decrease of 18% was noted for hurulla. Prices of salaya and balaya had decreased by 16% and 8% respectively. Further, prices of paraw and shrimp had decreased by 3% and the price of mora had decreased by 2%. However, prices of kelawalla and thalapath had increased by 5% and 1% respectively. Price of thora had not changed significantly. In the month of October, the average wholesale prices of selected fresh fish varieties ranged between Rs.126.62 – 976.33/kg. According to the data in previous years, fish prices could increase in the coming month due to the end of the fishing season in the Eastern coastal belt. Compared to the same period of 2015,

wholesale prices of all the fresh fish varieties had increased in the range of 1%-46% with the highest price increase noted for hurulla.

In line with the decreased wholesale prices, retail prices of all the fresh fish varieties except paraw had decreased. The highest price decreases were reported for salaya (12%) and balaya (10%). Prices of hurulla and mora had decreased by 4% while price of thalapath had decreased by 3%. Further, a price decrease of 1% was noted for shrimp. Prices of thora and kelawalla had not decreased significantly. Meanwhile, price of paraw had increased by 2%. In the month of October, the average retail prices of selected fresh fish varieties ranged between Rs.188.05-1,266.23/kg. Further, of the selected varieties, consumers had to pay Rs.130.00-1,660.00/kg when buying fresh fish during the month. Compared to the same period of 2015, retail prices of all the fresh fish varieties had increased in the range of 5%-45% with the highest price increase noted for balaya.

Dried Fish

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Supplies of local and imported dried fish were improved than the previous month and the availability of both local and imported stocks were satisfactory. The wholesale prices of all the dried fish except imported mora have decreased. However, the highest decrease was recorded as 13% for imported balaya followed by 11% for local balaya. Prices of local maduwa and salaya have decreased by 8% while the price of imported maduwa has decreased by 6%. The decrease in the prices of most of the other dried fish was less than 5%. Meanwhile, the price of imported mora has increased by 3% against the previous month as the previous month stocks of local and imported koduwa and imported salaya were not available in the market. Compared to the same period of last year prices of all the dried fish varieties except imported balaya, local mora and

imported maduwa had increased and it was significant for local sprats, local salaya, anguluwa and maduwa.

Stocks of local dried fish were mainly supplied from Kalpitiya, Batticaloa, Trincomalee, Puttalam, Mannar, Jaffna and Negambo areas. The main importing countries were India, Pakistan, United Arab Emirates, Oman, Vietnam and Thailand.

According to the reports of the Department of Sri Lanka Customs a quantity of 1835mt of dried sprats was imported in October. The total value of the imports was Rs.686mn. The quantity has decreased by about 100mt against the previous month. Out of the total imports 80% was imported from Thailand while 18% from United Arab Emirates. Rest of the stocks were imported from Iran, India, Indonesia and Vietnam in few quantities. The CIF price ranged between Rs.251.22-445.94/kg and the average price was Rs.373.91/kg.

Considering retail market though the wholesale prices of most of the dried fish have decreased the price change was not significant for most of the varieties. The decrease was 4% for mora while it was 3% for salaya. Compared to the same period of last year, prices of all the other dried fish varieties except imported sprats and maduwa had increased in the range of 2%-14% with the highest increase reported for anguluwa.

Eggs

Compared to September, prices of both brown and white eggs had further decreased significantly by 18% and 19% respectively at the wholesale level. Further, a decreasing trend in prices was observed throughout the month except in the third week and the prices remained unchanged during the third week. Most of the stocks had been supplied to the market from Hettipola, Kobeygane, Bingiriya, Wariyapola and Kuliyapitiya areas. The wholesale price range of a brown egg was Rs.10.50 - 14.80 and it was Rs.10.00 - 14.30 per white egg. Compared to the same period of the last year, wholesale prices of both brown and white eggs had decreased by 13% and 10% respectively.

In line with the decreased wholesale prices, prices of both brown and white eggs had also decreased by 13% at the retail level. The monthly average retail prices of a brown and a white egg were Rs.14.29 and Rs.13.27 respectively. Further, price ranges at the retail market were observed as Rs.11.00–17.00/brown egg and Rs.10.50–16.00/white egg. Compared to the same period of the last year, retail prices of both brown and white eggs had decreased by 6% and 7% respectively.

Meat

The supplies and demand situation was more or less same as the previous month. The prices of beef and pork have increased slightly while the prices of other meats have decreased. But the change was nearly 10% for chicken while it was insignificant for mutton. Compared to the same period of the last year prices of all the meat varieties except for pork had increased with the highest increase of 15% for beef.

6. Wheat grain, Wheat flour and Sugar

Wheat grain, Wheat flour

The quantity of imports of wheat grains was very high in previous two months, hence the quantity has shown a considerable decrease. Total quantity of 920,11mt of wheat grain imported in October and the value of the stock was Rs.3404mn. the average CIF price of wheat grain recorded as Rs.37.00/kg and it was an increase of Rs.2.39/kg against the previous month.

Out of the total imports, 78% imported from United States of America. In addition, 14% from Canada, 5% from Australia and another 1% each from India and Russia were imported. The CIF price ranged between Rs.29.91-40.48/kg. The lowest CIF price was reported for Russian wheat which consisted very few stocks of only 1026mt while the highest price was reported for Canadian wheats.

The quantity of 415mt valued at about Rs.28.2mn was imported as wheat flour. The average CIF price was Rs.67.89/kg recording a slight increase of cents 31/kg against the previous month.

The retail price of wheat flour ranged between Rs.85.00-95.00/kg and the average price was Rs.88.54/kg. Compared to the same period of last year, the retail price of wheat flour had increased by nearly 2%.

Sugar

The highest imports of sugar in this year recorded in March as 80,915 mt and exceeding that quantity of 81,791 mt was imported in October. The value of the total imports was Rs.7289mn.

The world sugar prices have shown a gradual increase with the beginning of this year and that trend continued this month too. In line with that, the average CIF price has increased further by Rs.5.05/kg against the previous month and it was Rs.89.12/kg. During the last ten months of this year the world sugar prices have increased by Rs.30.21/kg recording a 51% increase.

Among the total imports the highest quantity of 41768mt, as it is 51% was imported from Brazil, while 13% from Ukraine 8% from Thailand, 7% from France, 6% from India and 4% from United Arab Emirates was imported. Apart from that, a few quantities from Poland, Denmark, Austria, Singapore, Ecuador, Switzerland, Czech Republic, Korea, Netherlands, and Spain were also consisted. The CIF price ranged between Rs.85.06-101.94/kg. The lowest CIF price recorded for sugar which imported from Czech Republic from where a few quantities of only 230mt was imported. The highest CIF price recorded for Austrian sugar which was also imported only a 690mt. The majority among the imports from Brazil which fetched the price of Rs.88.28/kg.

Though the government has increased the special Commodity Levy for imported sugar from Cents 25/kg to Rs.2.00/kg with effect from 23rd September 2016 the retail price has not shown a significant change. The retail price ranged between Rs.85.00-95.00/kg and the average price was Rs.88.54/kg. But the CIF price has exceeded the retail price in an overall, hence the price increase could be expected in future months. Compared to the same period of the last year retail price of sugar had increased by about 2%.
