


RICE:

Retail prices of all the rice varieties, except for samba grade I, had increased compared to the previous month. Retail prices of all the rice varieties ranged between Rs.75.00-100.00/kg during the month. Retail price of samba grade I ranged between Rs.96.00-100.00/kg.



Supplies of vegetable were further limited during this month too. Hence, the prices of most of the vegetables have increased. The highest price increase (Rs.58.00/kg) was reported for bitter gourd. Vegetable prices are expected to increase further during next month too.

1. Paddy

Crop Situation

The early prospects of paddy crop in 2019 *Yala* season were not favorable in most of the major producing areas mainly due to the low water availability in major and minor irrigation reservoirs in major producing areas. The dry weather prevailed in major producing areas like North Central and Eastern Provinces. However, moderate amount of rainfall received to some parts in North Central Province during the latter part of the month. The land preparation and crop establishment were progress in some of the major producing areas like Polonnaruwa, Monaragala, Ampara and Embilipitiya by the end of the month. The official estimates of cultivated extent are not announced so far. However, the same period of 2017, which was the lowest progress year in the recent past reported nearly 200,000 Ha of cultivated extent. The cultivation outlook will be depending on the progress of monsoon rains during the next month.

Producer Prices

An increasing trend of paddy prices begin from the last month, continued throughout the month in all major producing areas due to the arrival of limited supplies of paddy to the markets. The limiting and reducing of releasing paddy to the markets by the farmers and the traders were observed mainly due to the uncertainty of the paddy crop progress in present *Yala* season. The monthly average prices of long grain white paddy have increased by 3-12% in major producing areas and the lowest increase recorded from Dehiattakandiya. The prices of short grain paddy have increased by less than 5% in all considered producing areas with the lowest increase from Anuradhapura. Prices of short grain and long grain white paddy were ranged between Rs.38.00-44.00/Kg and Rs.38.00-45.00/Kg. It was noted that, the prices of long grain white paddy are slightly higher than the price of short grain paddy. The monthly average prices of long grain red paddy have increased by 10% in Hambanthota and 9% in Embilipitiya and the prices ranged between Rs34.00-38.00/Kg in producing areas in Southern province. According to the field information it is expected to that increasing trend of paddy prices can be expected during next month due to the limited supply.

Compared to the same period of last year, the prices of short grain paddy varieties have shown a declining trend in all considered producing areas. The prices of short grain have decreased by 10%-30% with the highest decline from Dehiattakandiya. Meanwhile the prices of long grain white have increased by less than 15% in all considered major producing areas. The prices of long grain red have increased by 15% in Hambantota and 10% Embilipitiya (Table 1.1).

Rice Prices Demand/Supply Situation Wholesale Prices

Supplies of most of the rice varieties had decreased compared to the previous month due to the off season of paddy harvesting. Hence, the wholesale prices of most of the rice varieties had increased with the highest price increase of 8.27% for raw white. Wholesale price of nadu grade II had increased by 5% while the wholesale price of samba grade II and raw white had increased by 3%. Meanwhile, the wholesale prices of samba grade I and nadu grade I had decreased by 5% and 4% respectively due to decreased demand at high price levels. Imported rice varieties such as samba, raw white and nadu were not available at wholesale level.

Compared to the same period of last year, wholesale prices of most of the rice varieties had decreased with the highest price decrease of 19% for samba grade II, followed by samba grade I (11%). According to the Department of Customs of Sri Lanka, a quantity of 995mt of rice had been imported during the month of May 2019. The total expenditure on importing rice was Rs.81.1million in May 2019.

Retail Prices

In line with the wholesale prices, retail prices of most of the rice varieties had increased compared to the previous month with the highest price increase of 3% for nadu grade II and raw white. Retail price of samba grade I ranged between Rs.96.00-100.00/kg and the average price had dropped by 3%. The retail price of all the rice varieties remained between Rs.75.00-100.00/kg during the month.

Compared to the same period of last year, retail prices of all the rice varieties, except for raw white, had decreased with the highest price decrease of 16% for samba grade II.

2. Other Field Crops

2.1 Chilli

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Supplies of green chillie from main producing areas have decreased further during this month. Hence, both wholesale and retail prices of green chilli have increased by about Rs.29.00/kg and Rs.39.00/kg respectively. Average wholesale and retail prices of green chillie were Rs.147.00/kg and Rs.323.00/kg respectively and both prices have increased by about 81% and 39% respectively when compared to the same period of last year.

A quantity of 3,529mt of dried chillie was imported from India and it was a decrease of only 55mt compared to that of the last month. The CIF price was Rs.234.25/kg and it was an increase of Rs.17.00/kg compared to previous month. Hence, both wholesale and retail price of imported dried chillies have increased by about Rs.9.00/kg and Rs.4.00/kg respectively. Compared o the same period of last year, both wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chillie have increased by about 7%.

2.2 Red Onion and Big Onion Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The imported quantity of big onion during the month was about 17,976mt and this was about 1,723mt lower than the imported amount in the last month. Average CIF price was Rs.48.08/kg and it has increased by Rs.2.00/kg compared to that of previous month. Wholesale price of imported big onion has decreased by about Rs.3.00/kg while retail price has increased by about Rs.2.00/kg. Compared to the same period of last year, both wholesale and retail prices of imported big onion have decreased by about 13% and 6% respectively.

Supplies of both sinnan and vedalan from Jaffna, Puttalam and Trincomalee areas had decreased throughout this month as it was the end of the *Maha* harvesting season. Hence, wholesale prices of both sinnan and vedalan have increased by about Rs.9.00/kg and Rs.23.00/kg respectively. Retail prices of both sinnan and vedalan have also increased by about Rs.27.00/kg and Rs.26.00/kg respectively due to limited supplies.

About 516mt of red onion was imported from India during this month and it was an increase of 374mt compared to that of the previous month. Average CIF price was Rs.115.33/kg and it has an increase of Rs.33.00/kg compared to the last month. Wholesale price of imported red onion has increased by about Rs.35.00/kg while no stocks of imported red onion were available at the retail markets.

2.3 Potato

Crop Situation and Progress

Yala cultivation of potato was commenced in both Nuwara Eliya and Badulla districts. In Nuwara Eliya and Badulla districts, the targeted extents of potato for the *yala* 2019 are 884 ha and 1,504 ha. New cultivation was affected with prevailed dry weather condition in Nuwara Eliya district.

In Badulla district, most of the new cultivation for the *yala* season will be taken place in paddy fields after obtaining paddy harvest in those fields. According to field information, majority of the harvesting had been completed in hilly areas of Keppetipola, Bogahakumbura, Boralanda, Ambagasdova and Uvaparanagama areas of the Welimada DS division during the *maha* season and the supply was over from the month of May for Welimada potato.

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

A quantity of 12,591 mt of potato had been imported in May which was 1,726 mt higher than that was imported during the previous month. Imported stocks were mainly received from Pakistan (86%), followed by Bangladesh (10%). Compared to May, 2018 (10,508 mt), the imports were high during this month. Average CIF price was Rs.37.00/kg in May.

Both local and imported stocks were available in the market. With regard to local potato, the supply of Welimada potato was over due to end of the peak harvesting period. On average, the producer prices of Nuwara Eliya potato was Rs.124.00/kg in May. Supply of Nuwara Eliya potato was also at a low level. Hence, the wholesale price of Nuwara Eliya potato has increased by 3% in the Colombo wholesale market. Meanwhile, the wholesale and retail prices of imported potato have increased by 2% and 3% respectively. During the month, the wholesale prices of Nuwara Eliya and imported potatoes ranged between Rs.135.00-160.00/kg and Rs.90.00-100.00/kg. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of Nuwara Eliya (18%) and imported (15%) potatoes have increased. Prices of local potatoes are expected to be increased further in June.

2.4 Green gram and Cowpea

Prices and Supply/ Demand Situation

The wholesale price of green gram ranged between Rs.240.00kg and Rs.260.00kg with an average of Rs.252.00/kg in May 2019. The average price has been decreased by 1.5 percent compared to the previous month. Similarly, compared to the same period of last year, the wholesale price has been increased by 20%. In the meantime, the retail price of green gram ranged between Rs.260.00/kg and Rs.300.00/kg with an average of Rs.278.00/kg. Compared to the previous month, the retail price has not been changed significantly. However, compared to the same period of last year, the retail price for this month had been increased to around 14 % (Table 2.4.1).

Average wholesale prices of white and red cowpea were recorded as Rs.218.00/kg and Rs.248.00/kg, respectively in May 2019. The wholesale price of white cowpea ranged between Rs.210.00/kg and Rs.225.00/kg, while that of red cowpea ranged between Rs.240.00/kg and Rs.255.00/kg. Compared to the previous month, the wholesale price of white cowpea has decreased by 2% and red cowpea has been increased by around 4%. Compared to the same period of last year, the wholesale price of white cowpea has been decreased by around 1% and red cowpea wholesale price has increased around 22% (Table 2.4.1).

The average retail prices of white and red cowpea were recorded as Rs.276.00/kg and Rs.301.00/kg respectively. The retail price of white cowpea ranged between Rs.240.00/kg and Rs.320.00/kg, and that of red cowpea also ranged between Rs.260.00/kg and Rs.320.00/kg. Compared to the previous month, white and red cowpea have not been changed significantly. Compared to the same period of last year, the retail price of white cowpea has been decreased by 3% and red cowpea price has been increased by 4%. (Table 2.4.1).

A total of 766 mt of green gram has been imported during this month, and it is a decrease of 32% compared to the green gram quantity imported in the previous month. The average CIF price of a kilogram of a green gram was Rs.177.00/kg which was increased by 7 percent compared with the previous month. The total expenditure of the importation of green gram was recorded as Rs.135.81 million which has decreased by 27% of the total value spent on green gram importation compared to the previous month. Green gram has been imported from several counties which are Myanmar (40%), Australia (29%), Argentina (25%) and India (7%).

According to table 2.4.3, a total of 178 mt of white cowpea have been imported during this month. The imported quantity of cowpea has been decreased by 59% compared to April 2019. The average CIF price of white cowpea was recorded as Rs.123.47/kg. The total expenditure on cowpea imports has been decreased by 58% compared to the previous month. The total value of the cowpea imports was noted as approximately Rs.22 million. The highest quantity of cowpea was imported from Myanmar (32%), India (28%), Madagascar (26%) and Brazil (14%).

2.5 Red dhal

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The wholesale price of red dhal ranged between Rs.108/kg and Rs.110/kg with an average of Rs.109/kg, and the retail price ranged between Rs.120/kg and Rs.140.00/kg with an average of Rs.129/kg. Moreover, the difference between the two prices is Rs.20/kg during this month. The wholesale and retail prices have not been changed significantly compared with the previous month. Compared to the same period of last year, wholesale price has been decreased by 2% while the retail price has decreased by 1%.

During this month, a total of 12,502 mt of red dhal has been imported at an average CIF price of Rs.86/kg and CIF price has been decreased by 4 percent compared to the previous month. Of the total red dhal quantity, the largest quantity (i.e., 11,442 mt) was of the whole type while the rest (i.e., 1,060 mt) was of the split type. The whole type of red dhal, from Canada (87%), Australia (12%) and Ukraine (1%). The total value of the whole type of red dhal imports was Rs. 949 million. With an average CIF price of Rs.83 per kilo and the split type red dhal, has been imported from Canada (81%), United Arab Emirate (12%) and India (7%). The average CIF price of split type was noted as Rs.118 per kilo and the total value of the imports of split type was Rs.125 million.

3. Vegetables

Crop Situation

Dry weather condition further prevailed in most of vegetable producing areas during this month too. The rainfall received to main vegetable producing area during this month was considerably low compared to the past 30-years average rainfall data (Table 8). Vegetable cultivation in rain fed areas was further delighted while *Yala* cultivation dominated by irrigated lands. Further, according to the past experience, generally crop damaged are reported due to heavy rains in the month of May, however, such incident has not reported during this year. Therefore, a satisfactory level of production is expected from the prevailing crops in the field as of this month.

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Vegetable supplies have further limited in the most of the market during the month due to off season. Daily supplies to the Dambulla Dedicated Economic Center was about 1000-1200mt, a decrease by 50% compared to the previous month.

As a result of low stocks available in the markets, the wholesale prices of most of vegetable varieties have increased during the month. With regard to the upcountry vegetable prices, the highest price increase was reported for carrot (89%) while the lowest price increase was noted for leeks (33%). With regard to lowcountry vegetable prices, the wholesale prices of all the lowcountry vegetables, except for drumsticks have also increased recording the highest for pumpkin (128%) followed by brinjal (102%). In contrast, the prices of drumstick has decreased by 14%. Moreover, the supplies of lime further limited during this month too resulting a price increase of 93% compared to the last month.

Compared to the same period of last year, prices of upcountry vegetable varieties had increased by 17%-64% while that of lowcountry vegetable increased by 5%-145%.

The retail prices of both upcountry and lowcountry vegetable also have increased during the month. The highest price increase of Rs.58.00/kg was recorded for bitter gourd while the lowest price increase of Rs.12.00/kg was noted for ash plantain. Meanwhile, the price of lime has considerably increased by Rs.256.00/kg. Drumstick was the only vegetable that recorded a price decrease of Rs.61.00/kg during the month. Compared to the same period of last year, the prices of most of the vegetable varieties had increased by 2%-31%.

4. Fruits Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Compared to the prices in April, 2019, wholesale prices of pineapple, papaw, passion fruit, wood apple and orange had increased in May 2019 while, the prices of banana, mango, avocado, slime apple and imported grapes had decreased. Accordingly, prices of medium and large sized pineapple had increased by 3% and 1% respectively and the monthly average wholesale prices of medium and large sized fruits were Rs.133.00/fruit and Rs.168.00/fruit respectively and the price ranged between Rs.110.00-200.00/fruit. Price of papaw had increased by 1% and the monthly average wholesale price was Rs.67.00/kg and the price ranged between Rs.40.00-90.00/kg. In addition, prices of wood apple, passion fruit and orange had increased by 45%, 21% and 17% respectively (Table 4.1).

As stated earlier, prices of all the banana varieties had recorded price decreases in the range of 8%-16% compared to April, 2019. Prices of Kolikuttu and Ambul had decreased by 11% while, price of Seeni had decreased by 8% and their price ranges recorded during the month were Rs.100.00-140.00/kg (Kolikuttu), Rs.30.00-60.00/kg (Ambul) and Rs.40.00-70.00/kg (Seeni). Prices of banana varieties, Ambun and Anamalu also had recorded 16% and 8% price decreases respectively and the price ranged between Rs.10.00-16.00/fruit for Ambun and Rs.8.00-13.00/fruit for Anamalu.

With regard to prices of mango varieties, Betti, Karthakolomban and Vilad had decreased by 32%, 31% and 29% respectively and their price ranges recorded for a fruit were Rs.12.00-22.00, Rs.30.00-60.00 and Rs.13.00-28.00 respectively. In addition, 24%, 17% and 9% price decreases were noted for avocado, slime apple and imported grapes respectively. Further, though the prices of medium and large sized pineapple had increased, the price of small sized pineapple had decreased by 2% and the price was noted as Rs.60.00-120.00/fruit (Table 4.1).

Compared to the same period of 2018, wholesale prices of most of the banana and mango varieties, orange, slime apple and imported grapes had decreased with the highest price decrease of 27% recorded for banana variety Ambun while, prices of pineapple, papaw, passion fruit, wood apple and avocado had increased with the highest price increase of 167% recorded for wood apple (Table 4.1).

According to the data in previous years, prices of fruit varieties, papaw, pineapple, mango, wood apple, orange, avocado, slime apple and banana varieties, Anamalu and Ambun are expected to be increased in the coming month, June while, prices of other banana varieties, Kolikuttu, Ambul and Seeni and passion fruit are expected to be decreased.

In analyzing the prices at the retail level, it was observed that the prices of most of the fruit varieties had decreased in the month of May compared to April. Accordingly, price decreases were noted for all the banana varieties with the highest price decrease of 11%. Prices of Ambul, Seeni and Kolikuttu had decreased by 11%, 5% and 4% respectively and their price ranges were noted as Rs.60.00-100.00/kg, Rs.80.00-130.00/kg and Rs.150.00-200.00/kg respectively. Further, price of banana variety, Ambun had decreased by 1% while, price of Anamalu had not changed significantly and prices of Ambun and Anamalu ranged between and Rs.18.00-25.00/fruit and Rs.15.00-20.00/fruit respectively. Prices of mango varieties, Karthakolomban, Vilad and Betti had also decreased in the range of 26%-40%. Price of a Karthakolomban fruit was noted as Rs.40.00-100.00. In addition, prices of avocado, slime apple and orange had decreased by 17%, 3% and 1% respectively, while, prices of passion fruit and imported grapes had decreased by 7% (Table 4.2).

On the other hand, prices of small, medium and large sized pineapple had increased by 5%, 2% and 1% respectively and price range recorded for pineapple was Rs.80.00-280.00/fruit. Price of papaw had also increased by 9% and the price ranged between Rs.90.00-180.00/kg. Further, price of wood apple had increased by 22% and the price was noted as Rs.30.00-100.00/fruit (Table 4.2).

Compared to the same period of 2018, retail prices of all the fruit varieties except orange and slime apple had increased with the highest price increase of 68% noted for both passion fruit and wood apple (Table 4.2).

With reference to the producer prices, producers had received decreased prices for banana varieties, Ambul and Kolikuttu and papaw and prices had decreased by 18%, 15% and 5% respectively. Further, producer prices for Ambul, Kolikuttu and papaw during the month ranged between Rs.13.00-38.00/kg, Rs.77.00-90.00/kg and Rs.22.00-74.00/kg respectively. At the same time, compared to May, 2018, producer prices had increased for papaw by 62%, for Kolikuttu by 45% and for Ambul by 18% (Table 4.3).

Exports/Imports of Fruits

According to the Sri Lanka Customs, Sri Lanka had exported 973mt of fresh fruits in May, 2019 to the value of Rs.133mn. Of the exported quantity, 90% were papaw, 6% were fresh pineapple, 3% were fresh mangoes and 1% was fresh avocados. In the month of April, 2019, the quantity exported was 743mt. Therefore, compared to last month, the exported quantity had increased by 31% (Table 4.4).

With reference to imports, Sri Lanka had imported 2,884mt of fresh fruits during the month and the value was Rs.601mn. Of the imported quantity, 68% were apple, 18% were oranges and 14% were grapes. The main importing countries of apple were South Africa, New Zealand, the United States and China. Egypt and Australia were the importing countries of oranges. Grapes had been imported from Australia and India. In the month of April, 2019, the quantity imported was 3,590mt. Therefore, compared to last month, the imported quantity had decreased by 20% (Table 4.5).

5. Fish, Dried Fish, Eggs and Meat

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Wholesale prices of all the fish varieties have further increased in the range of 4%-33%. The highest price increase was noted for Hurulla. The wholesale prices for fish ranged between Rs.120.00/kg (Salaya) and Rs.1400.00/kg (Thora). Compared to the same period of last year, the wholesale prices of all the fish varieties had increased by 3%-34% (Table 5.1).

The retail prices of fish also have increased during the month. Shrimps (small), Thalapath and Thora have increased by less than 10% while the prices of all other fish varieties have increased by 10%-19%. Compared to the same period of last year, retail prices of all the fish varieties had increased by 10%-44% (Table5.1).

Dried Fish

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The wholesale prices of most of dried fish varieties have increased during the month. The highest price increase was reported for Balaya(20%) followed by Sprats(15%). The prices of all other dried fish varieties have increased by 8% or less. The highest wholesale price of Rs.1,350.00/kg was reported for imported Thora while the lowest price of Rs.300.00/kg was noted for Salaya. Meanwhile, the prices of Anguluwa (imported and local), and Maduwa (imported and local) have decreased by 3%-8%. Compared to the same period of last year, wholesale prices of most of dried fish varieties had increased by 1%-26%.

The retail prices of all the dried fish varieties have increased by 2%-9%. The highest price of Rs.2000.00/kg was reported for Thora while the lowest price of Rs.500.00/kg was observed for Sprats(imported) and Salaya. Compared to the same period of last year, prices of all the fish varieties had increased by 1%-16% (Table 5.2).

Eggs

As depicted in the Table 5.3 below, the wholesale prices of both brown egg and white egg have decreased by 17% and 18% respectively. The prices for brown egg and white egg ranged between Rs.15.00-16.50/each and Rs.14.50-15.50/each. However, compared to the same period of last year, prices of both brown egg and white egg had increased by 11% and 12% respectively.

Meat

The prices of all the types of meat except for Mutton have decreased during the month. The prices of broiler chicken decreased by 10% followed by curry chicken as 12%. The highest price of Rs.2000.00/kg was reported for Mutton while the lowest prices of Rs.420.00/kg was observed for broiler chicken. Compared to the same period of last year, prices of chicken had decreased by 4%-6%. Meanwhile, the prices of pork had increased by 38% followed by beef and Mutton as 2%.

6. Wheat grain, Wheat flour and Sugar

Wheat grain and Wheat flour

A total quantity of 148,620mt. worth of Rs.7,211mn. wheat grain had been imported during the month of May. Compared to the previous month, quantity of this month has decreased and it was 26,588mt. in terms of quantity. Wheat grain for the month of May had been mainly imported from United States (51%) and the CIF price was Rs.48.00/kg. Second and third highest wheat grain quantities were imported from Canada (45,078mt.) and Pakistan (18,881mt.) respectively. In addition, wheat grain had been imported from Australia (5%). Few quantities were also imported from India as well. The CIF price of wheat grain ranged between Rs.44.00-66.00/kg and the average CIF price was recorded as Rs.49.00/kg. Compared to the previous month, average CIF price for wheat grain remained unchanged during the month. The lowest CIF price was reported for the stocks from Pakistan.

A total quantity of 1,011mt. of wheat flour worth of Rs.71mn. had been imported during the month of May. Compared to the previous month, quantity of this month has increased nearly four times in terms of quantity. Wheat flour for the month of May had been mainly imported from India (31%) and its' CIF price was Rs.77.00/kg. Further, wheat flour had been imported from Pakistan (15%) and Germany (1%) as well. In addition, few quantities were also imported from China, Italy and Hong Kong. The CIF price for wheat flour for the month of May ranged between Rs.58.00-86.00/kg (for main three importing countries, which represent more than 95% from the total wheat flour imports).

Meanwhile, the local retail price of wheat flour ranged between Rs.87.00-100.00/kg and the average price was Rs.94.00/kg. The average retail price of wheat flour remained unchanged during the month. Further, compared to the same period of last year, retail price of wheat flour has increased by 4%.

Sugar

A total quantity of 54,051mt. worth of Rs.3,321mn. of sugar had been imported to the country during the month of May. Compared to the previous month, quantity of this month has increased and it was 23,695mt. in terms of quantity. This was the highest quantity which imported to the country since this January. Sugar for the month of May had been mainly imported from India (91%) and its' CIF price was Rs.61.00/kg. The second highest sugar quantity was imported from Thailand (8%). Furthermore, sugar has also imported from Korea (1%). In addition, few quantities were also imported from United Arab Emirates and Malaysia as well.

The CIF prices ranged between Rs.61.00-86.00/kg and the average CIF price was reported as Rs.61.00/kg. Compared to the previous month, average CIF price for sugar has decreased only by Rs.1.00/kg. According to the Food and Agriculture Organization, sugar price index averaged 176 points in May 2019, down by 3.2% from April 2019. This is due to weaker international energy prices as well as prospects of increased sugar output in India.

Referring to the local retail price of sugar for the month of May, price ranged between Rs.97.00-110.00/kg and the average retail price was Rs.99.00/kg. Compared to the previous month the average retail price of sugar has decreased by Rs.5.00/kg. Further, compared to the same period of last year, average retail price of sugar has decreased by 8%.
